If you are getting this for anyone over age 8, you may want to reconsider. That being said, I purchased this for my 7 year old who is Minecraft-obsessed; he is reading at an early/mid 1st grade level and this is perfect for him. Large print is helpful for tracking, short chapters are encouraging, and word choice is predominantly sight words with a scattering of 2-3 syllabe descriptors which are great

for working on phonics. He loves to read it and feels really good about reading a "chapter book" independently (mostly). Great piece of literature...not so much.
