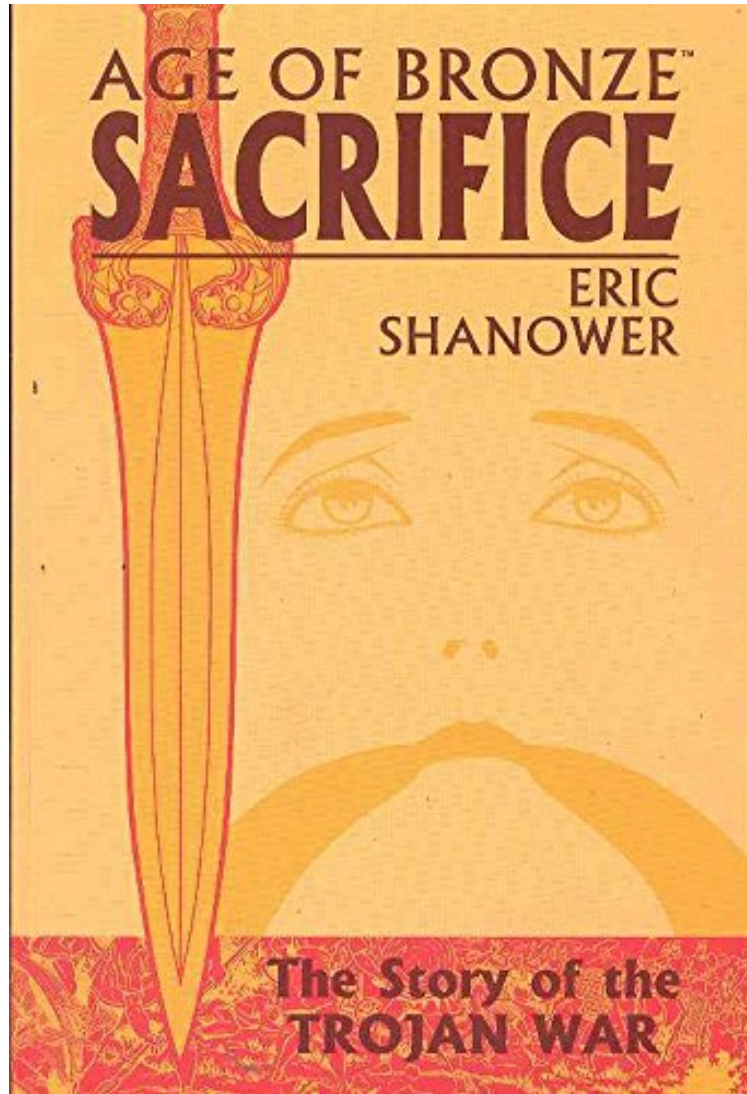

Avid reader I know the story well enough, through the many books on ancient Greeks at my grandfathers house, although I've never read Homer. This rendition is mind-blowing. The amount of detail and research done by Mr. Shanower is the reason one has to wait a couple of years between each hard bound edition. I can think of few better ways of engaging younger readers in the classical world than this series. Seriously, this is the longest I've thought out my entertainment life. I just want to be alive when all 7 volumes are completed in trade cloth. It's similar to getting hooked on Tintin as a kid, if that helps you get the feeling, although the artwork is obviously different. Finally, this is the first graphic novel that made me cry for the fate of a character. It's that "real."
