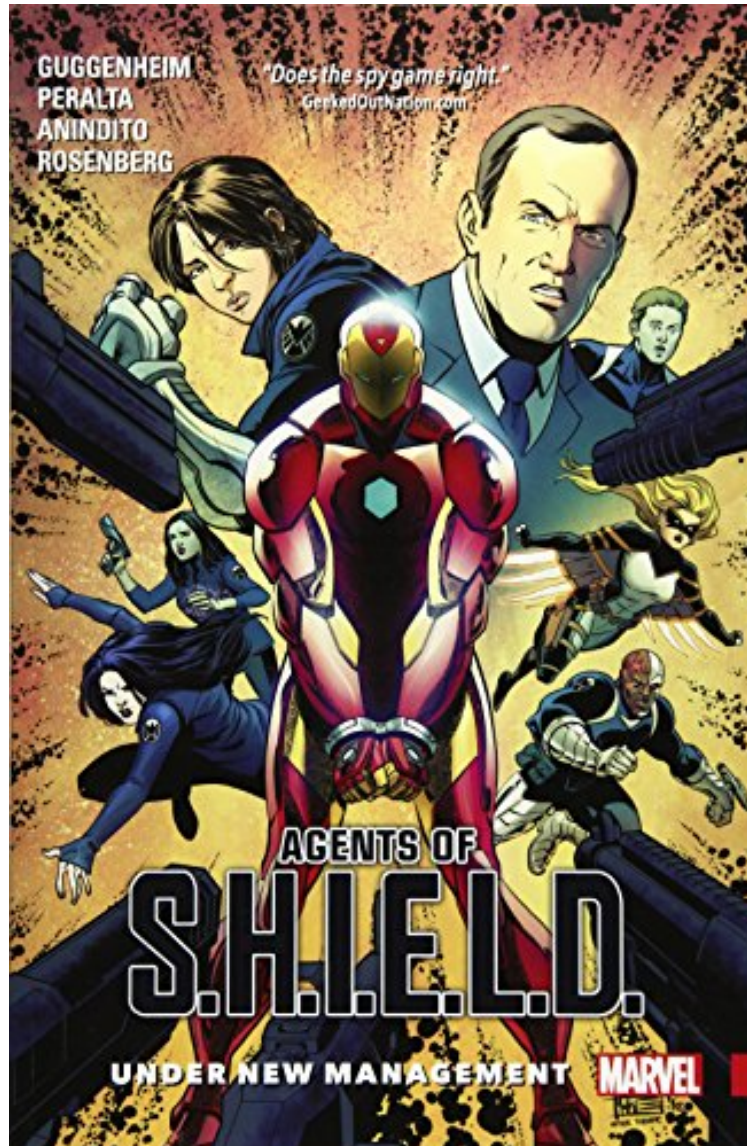

Like other reviewers have mentioned, it doesn't fall directly in line with events taking place in the show, such as certain character dynamics and certain characters being on the team. This doesn't bother me however, as it all feels "inspired by" the TV show in the same way many TV shows are just "inspired by" adaptation of comic series. Judging the book just by it's story, I really enjoyed it. It's a fun spy thriller with typical super-powered sci-fi sprinkled in. But what's great about this series as opposed to other full-fledged highly powered superhero books is that the majority of the characters in peril are just humans. The stakes feel bigger when it's a team of mostly humans, because it's just a series just called COULSON so you know Phil Coulson isn't going to die. It's about SHIELD and the team can go on without any one or two individual members. There was plenty of drama and twists and turns that I didn't see coming. The most outrageous difference is the complete absence of FitzSimmons's relationship, especially considering that Simmons spends most of this volume in a coma! TV Fitz would be upset that the love of his life is dying; comic book Fitz doesn't seem to know or care. Another aspect that will surprise fans of the show--Ward is not only alive, but working at SHIELD again! Other differences include: Bobbi is back on the team, Deathlok is Henry Hayes (not Mike Peterson), Mack is nowhere to be found.If you read this comic pretending it's a crazy AU fanfic, maybe you'll like it. But honestly, I've read much better fanfiction.
