He's still trying to get her to understand though that not all humans are open to a sentient android so she learns to balance being both, but as the two spend more time together you can feel the tension between them grow and it leaves you begging for something to happen! Alex starts to take her out places and to meet his friends and family. They both know they're taking a huge risk, but like I said the feelings are growing so Alex and Ada continue on the path.
