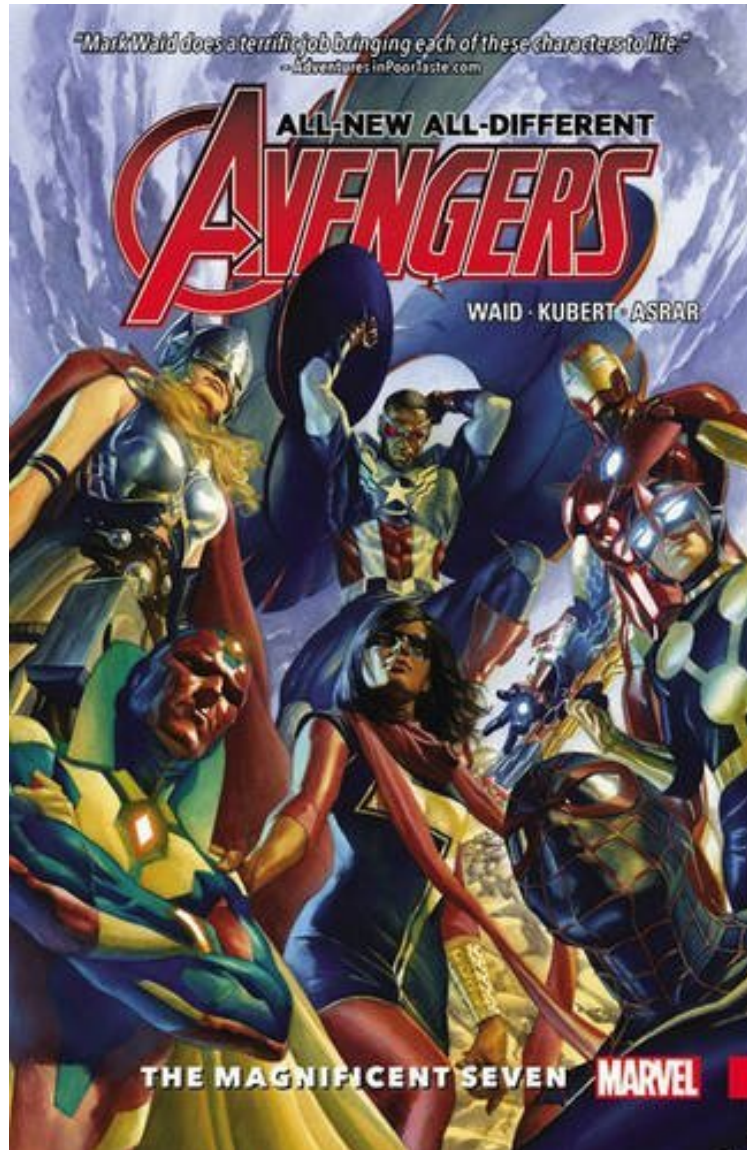

The "grown ups" are each dealing with their own issues which complicates everything, of course, but I wouldn't want to spoil it.
