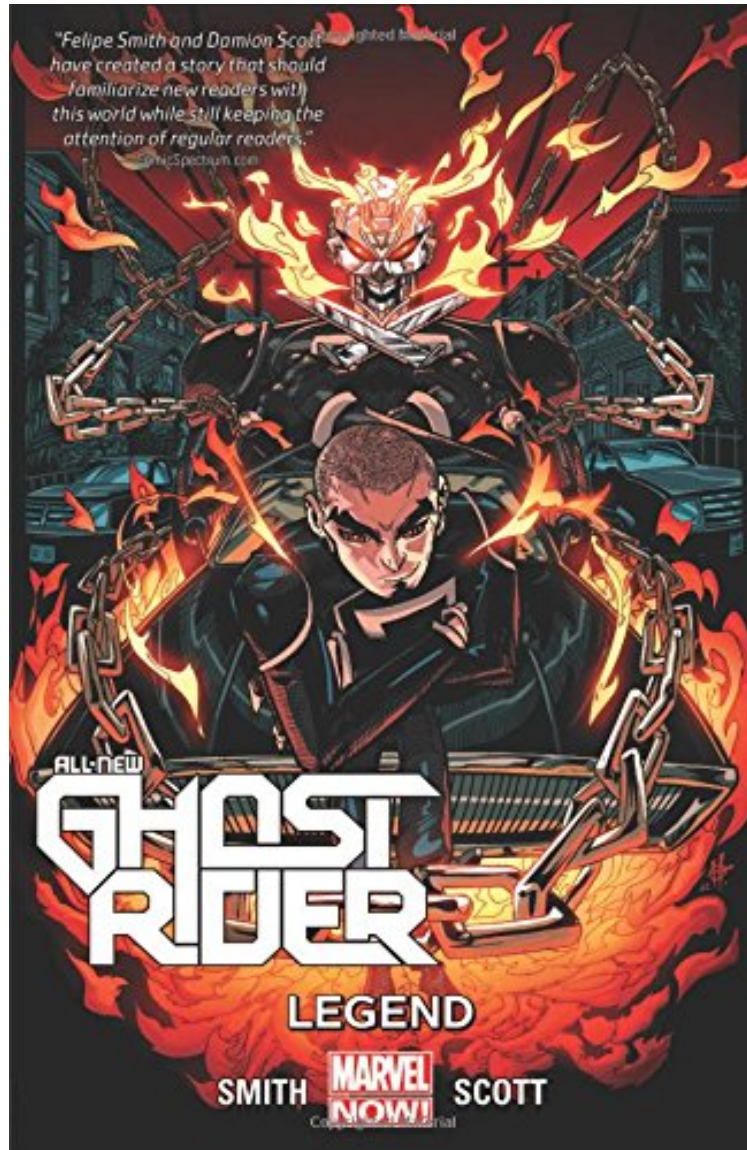

The writing and art take severe hits in quality. I don't know why the artist left, but the new guy for the first few issues/chapters of this collection seems to want to imitate the other guy's style, but in a more kiddie kind of way. The art gets better, toward the end, but it's still not as

great as the first trade. The writing also seems to become a little phoned in, for the lack of better words. The first half of this trade felt agonizing. I just wanted that arc to end. Then, when the next one picks up, I wanted the whole thing just to be over. It's a very quick ending, as well. Characters flip their point of view and their beliefs faster than most other stories, while other characters learn things faster and embrace their fate faster than you'd expect. This whole thing seems rushed. I really enjoyed the first trade, though. I wish I never found out about this one and just believed the first trade was the only and the end of the series.

Although I liked the artwork from the first trade a whole lot more, the Hell Charger and the design of the All-New Ghost Rider still look great. The story gets a bit confusing with the spirit that inhabits Robbie being his deceased uncle Eli who happened to be a satanist serial killer. The tone of Eli changes drastically from the first book to this book; in the first book Eli seemed to be concerned with vengeance and burning down the evil in Hill Rock Heights. In this book he is going after the mob bosses that had him killed, he is also a whole lot more evil. To add to the confusion, Gabe's disability is never quite clarified. In the first book it appears that he has an intellectual disability along with possible cerebral palsy? In this second book, Gabe appears to have much more cognitive capabilities and is not totally non-ambulatory. Wish the story had a little more consistency. However, it is still a lot of fun, especially to see Robbie meet Johnny Blaze.

Really good spin on it. The opening artwork wasn't as good as was in the first book, but it did get better as it went along. But the history of Jonny Blaze was not altogether correct. They probably didn't have enough time to explain everything, and it is complicated, or just didn't do the research. To make it short the spirit Zarathros was taken out of Blaze and stuck in a crystal. Then his brother Danny Ketch, became the next Ghost Rider who eventually gave it back to Blaze. It's quite a history between the two so google it for a more in depth version of events. I really hope this series continues it has a lot of potential. The inconsistent artwork is a pet peeve of mine and character history is as well. The story is solid however as is the character development. Check it out.
