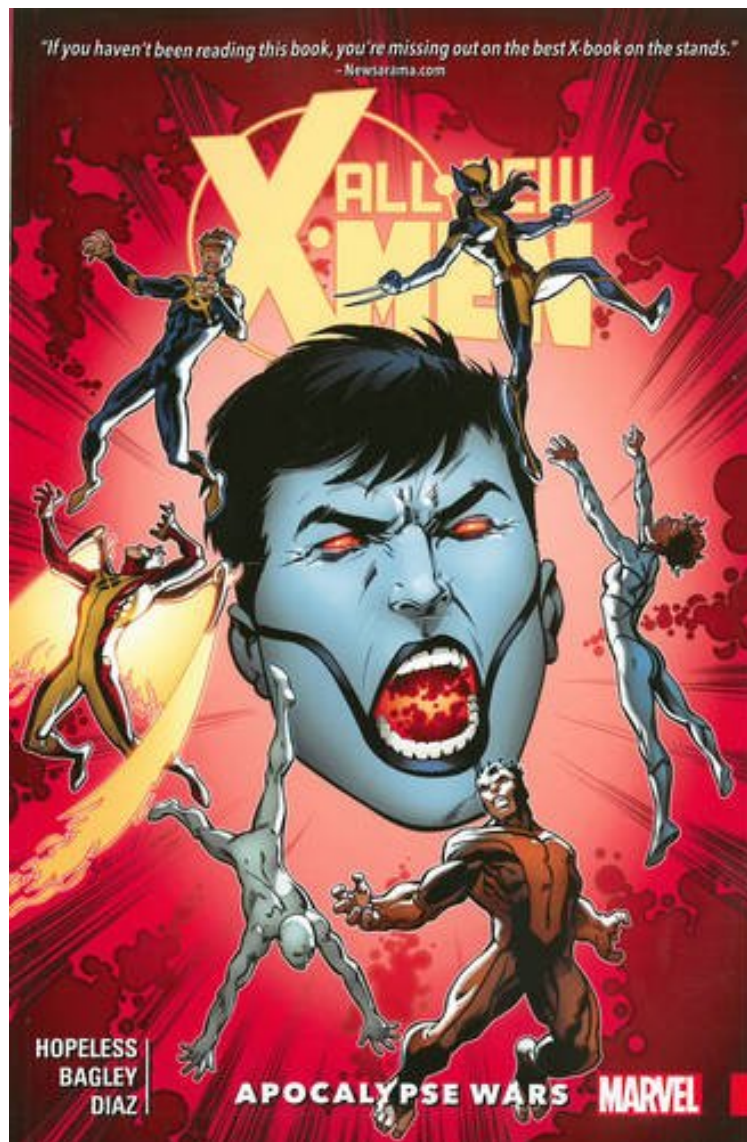

WellsCollecting: All-New X-Men (2015) #7-11This volume of All-New X-Men opens with Cyclops in dire straits and at the mercy of (a very drunk) Toad (see All-New X-Men: Inevitable Vol. 1: Ghost of the Cyclops for the backstory). The rest of the volume, however, is part of the X-Men: Apocalypse Wars crossover. Fortunately, this crossover between X-titles is fairly loosely connected and does not require additional reading in order to follow the story.Evan (the young clone of Apocalypse) is at the center of the Apocalypse Wars story included here. Through mystical means Evan is transported to ancient Egypt where he meets young En Sabah Nur. This story arc offers a bit of back story to the Apocalypse who frequents the pages of the X-Men (and recently appeared on the big screen: X-men: Apocalypse Blu-ray!). While I thought it was an interesting moment to explore--the young innocent En Sabah Nur dealing with the pressures of a domineering father--I also felt that the offered explanation for the rise of Apocalypse was a bit too easy even for a comic book.I enjoyed many of the small details in this book, especially the episode with Dr Strange (and Pickles!), but it is an uneven book that ultimately gets 3.5/4.0-star review. Evan's introspective interaction with young Apocalypse was compelling and enjoyable. However, the flat bad dad polemic seems like a lost opportunity. Mark Bagley's artwork, however, was not my favorite, and there were not many moments to linger on.
