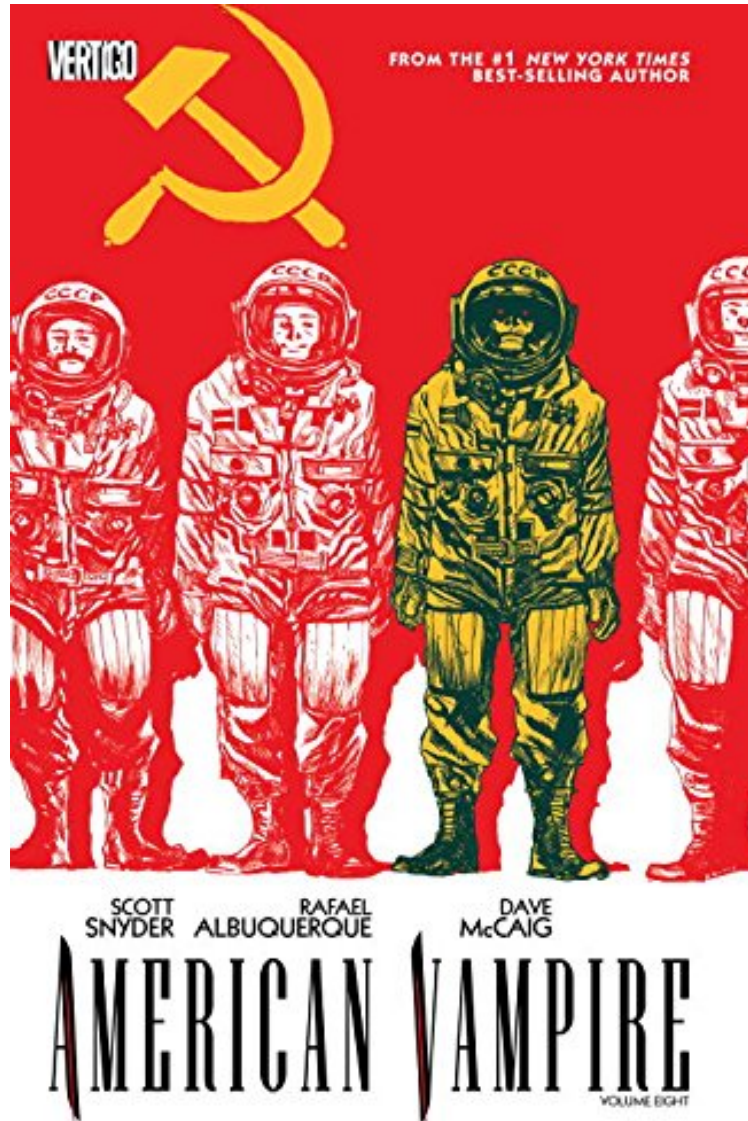

behind it, we check in with a lot of old friends and enemies, and of course, as you guessed from the cover: vampires in space! And Rafael Albuquerque is as great as always. Why only three stars, then? There are a TON of typos, especially towards the end. On one page, "soldier" is spelled "solider" four times in a row. This is a major release from one of the biggest publishers in the country, and that lack of professionalism in the execution of the book really soured the experience of reading it for me. So, fellow spelling nerds, you've been warned. I lost count, but there are lots and lots of misspelled words in this book. The worst elements are when the series's very rich and complex mythology gets a bit too overblown and confusing for its own good. The scenes in space and some aspects of Pearl's Area 51 mission are great, but these issues get somewhat bogged down in taxonomy and vampire history. They're worth reading as part of the continuation of an amazing series, but this is not one of the stronger sets.
