I love the Sub-Diego era of Aquaman. I think the first two volumes collected in "Sub-Diego" and "To Serve and Protect" were very good. This volume is not as strong, but it does serve to complete the set. I only wish it had a stronger conclusion, the way it ends you would not realize the next issue would greatly shift the Status Quo by introducing a new Aquaman in "Sword of Atlantis." I wish

more stories had been told set within the Sub-Diego realm, and that it had had more of a lasting impact on Aquaman stories. This is the weakest collection in this series, but Aquaman collectors need to have it. I only wish it hadn't ended like it did, and we got more of Aquaman and Aquagirl defending the sunken city of Southern California before the New 52 and Rebirth, where the events here now seem to have been entirely retconned.
