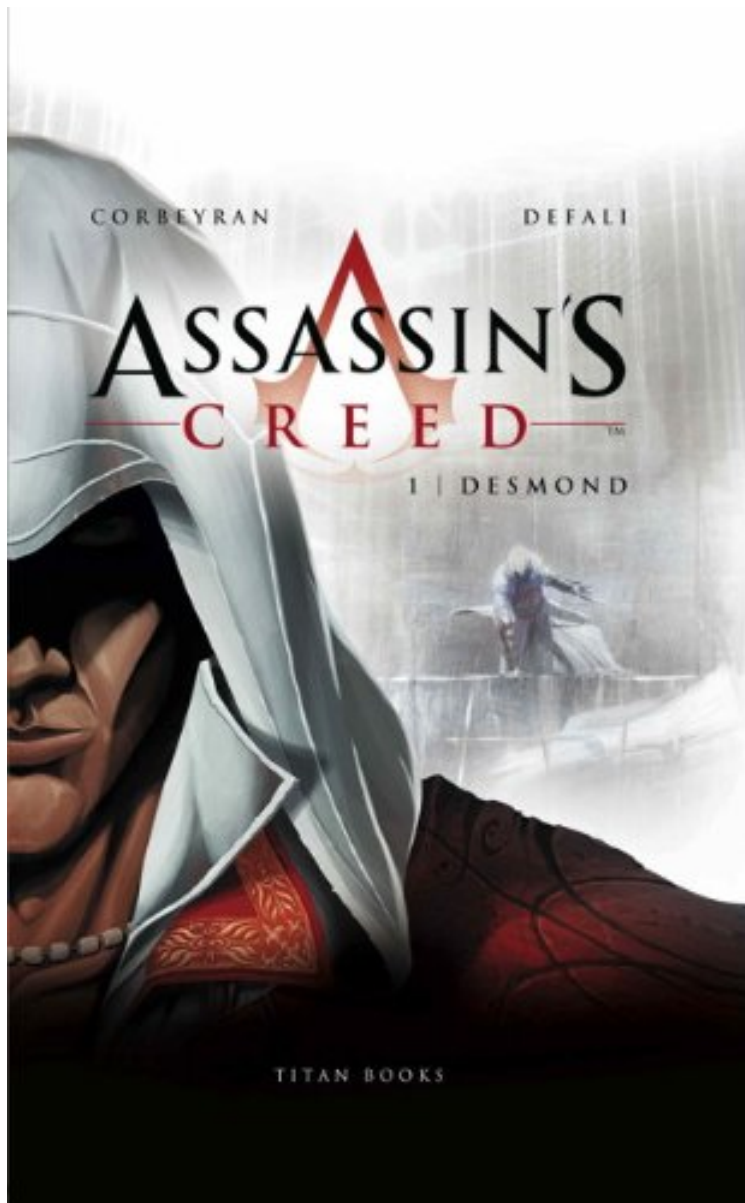

Books, covers the first issue of the story following Desmonds initial capture and work with his ancestor Altair as well as Aquilus of the Roman Empire. This book makes an effort to try to explain why Abstergo has Desmond and what theyre doing with him but having played the game gives you a much better insight. Eric Corbeyran made a valiant attempt at staying true to the story but some of it has been changed slightly. Not enough to completely throw off the story but its not identical to the games. Otherwise, we get a peek at Subject 16 and Aquilus but Im guessing well see more of them in the following books. This edition is an oversized hardcover with no dustjacket. It has been translated from the original French language it was published in and the translation is perfect. You cant even tell it was originally another language like is common with some mangas. The book is quite short at only 48 pages given the \$10 price tag but its worth picking up if you can find it cheaper. This is the first part of the first chapter (3 issues) and there is a second chapter that is another 3 issues as well.
