because, after the initial set-up, nothing ever moves forward. I feel like I have been running in place. The origin bombs are causing havoc on Earth and the Avengers are flying all over the planet putting out fires. Only, fighting it isn't working and so far there's no sciencing their way out of it either. Yet, the Avengers still "need to get bigger." Which just means adding the brand new, just created characters of Starbrand, Nightmask and also the ones who apparently caused all the trouble in the first place: Ex Nihilo and Abyss. I agree with other reviewers that all this just seems to be build-up for the Infinity Crossover. But, three volumes of foreplay to finally get to the action is...boring. I just didn't care at all. This threat is supposed to be more dangerous than any ever faced before. But, the Avengers have faced intergalactic apocalypses before. The difference is how they overcome it but readers aren't getting that. The best part of the volume, and the only reason I gave it two stars, is the interaction between Thor and Hyperion. Finally, we get a character's personal perspective on the crisis from a familiar hero (and not Nightmask's technobabble rambling). I have the Infinity collection which I intend to read next, and I truly hope it resolves this long, drawn-out plot so the writers can do something better with these characters. Because, honestly, The Avengers should be Marvel's flagship series and currently it sucks. Not recommended - try any of the solo hero series, or the superb Avengers Assemble, as they are all well worth reading.

Cons: This is easily the worst chapter if only because nothing really gets accomplished. There is very little in terms of actual character development. Pros: the artwork is stunning. Caselli and Deodato provide very nice pencil work. Every now and then, Hickman even writes a funny line or two through Superior Spider-Man. You won't regret buying this volume, but you won't feel particularly rewarded, either.

I didnt particularly think that Hickman spent enough time on introducing all of these new characters either. Theyre all sort of thrown into the mix. I realize that part of this is Hickmans style, but whereas in Hickmans FF I always felt he had a good pace going, his Avengers thus far has seemed like a very long introduction to the story he really wants to tell. Well see if its worth it.
