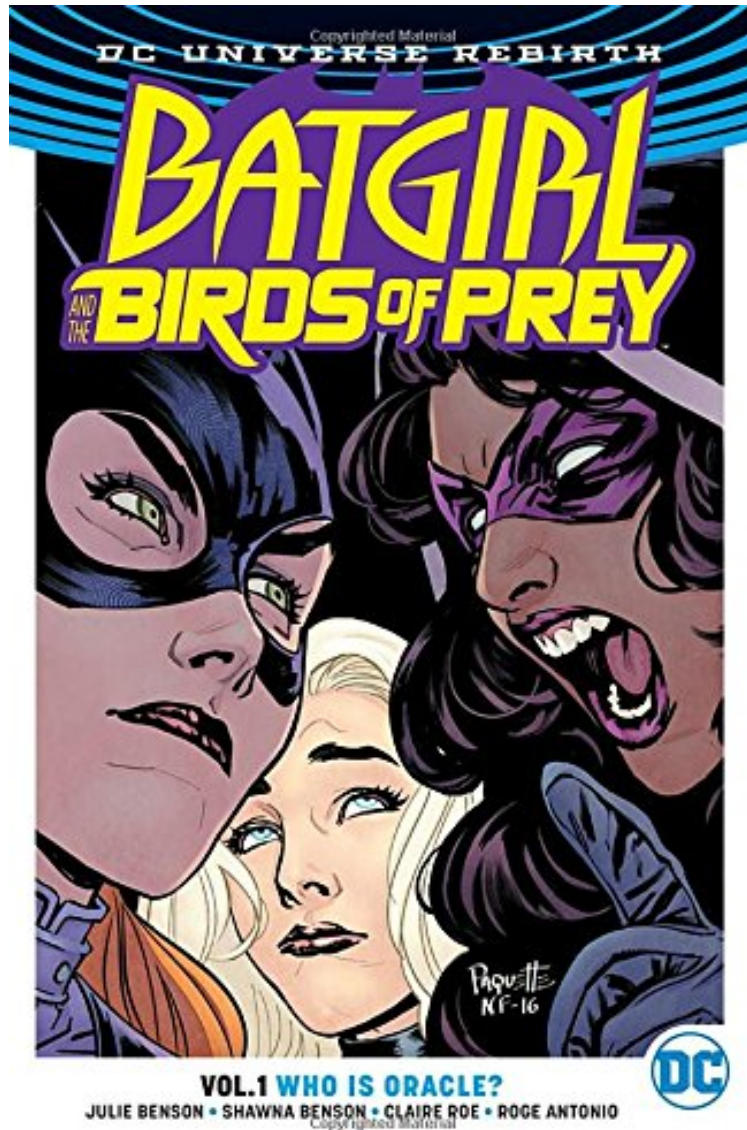

By AltBatgirls nemesis in this volume is Oracle. But wait, isnt Batgirl Oracle? Well, she was, but now theres a new Oracle in Gotham, and its not a software company. The story first recaps Barbara Gordons history as a disabled crimefighter and her relationship with Black Canary and her rebirth as Batgirl. Now recapped, the story follows Batgirl, reunited with Black Canary, to find this new Oracle, a hacker who seems to be selling information to the Mafia. The story takes it first wrong turn by introducing the Matron, who is reinventing herself as yet another tedious purveyor of vengeance, taking out Mafia hitmen because she got fired by Spyril. That makes no sense, but neither does bringing a crossbow to a gunfight. The story makes even less sense, and in fact becomes incoherent, when it focuses on snake villains. Eventually the story gets around to explaining why theres another Oracle, but the explanation is lame. Interspersed with the snakes are scenes of weepy melodrama, as we learn about Black Canarys sad childhood and Huntress sad childhood. I would have wept if I hadnt been busy gagging. And the melodrama leads to a reveal thats just Oh So Surprising except its too contrived to pass as good writing. Worse, its followed by an even more preposterous round of melodrama. But then at the end group hug! Superhero bonding! Sigh. The art is a little cartoony for my taste, but it isnt awful.

Time is taken to give each of the ladies a decent background story leading up to them reforming this team-up. The story was good involving them temporarily joining forces to find out who is using Batgirl's former alias, Oracle. Along the way, they meet up with Huntress and help her with her cause. My favourite character in this was by far Huntress, she's the only one with a real edge and I don't know her too well having read only one book featuring her previously. Batgirl is a bit of a disappointment though as she's immature, a do-gooder and rather dowdy. Her costume is too big for her and looks like a track suit. Black Canary's character fits between the two others with her sometimes agreeing with one then the other. I was surprised her team-up/relationship with Green Arrow wasn't mentioned as I'd just finished that book previously. I like her better in the GA book. Anyway, good story; I'll always read Batgirl no matter what they do to her and I've got a newfound interest in Huntress!

By Wendell Im really starting to think this whole Rebirth thing isnt for me. Actually, I really liked the New 52 A LOT, so I wasnt all that excited about Rebirth anyway. But I thought Id like it better than I have so far. And Batgirl and the Birds of Prey is the latest book to leave me wondering why DC did this. Here the Birds of Prey (Batgirl, Black Canary, and Huntress) get back together to discover what criminal is using Babs old Oracle alias to spread crime across Gotham City. Not only are the criminals causing terror around town, they are also smearing Oracles good name, which really upsets Batgirl. On the good side, this book actually introduces each of these characters. The origins of Batgirl, Black Canary, and Huntress are explained so that new readers (like me) understand who these guys are and why they are together. And, I guess, the story itself was pretty easy to follow, did get better as it went forward, and had an okay twist at the end. So this graphic novel isnt horrible, and Im sure lots of people will find it a good read. But I didnt like it. To start with, I never liked the artwork. All the characters looked strange, seemed out of proportion at times, and had some serious Anime facial expressions going on. I know other people loved it, saying it was gritty, or something. Maybe, it was. I dont know. All I know is I hated it. Guess we all like different things. As for the characters, I guess they just were not for me. Batgirl and Black Canary had no real personality; Huntress wanted to kill everyone all the time; and the trio spent the whole time arguing about different things. I mean, okay, I can see Batgirl and Huntress not liking one another cause they both have dated Nightwing, but all the bickering and stuff got old. After a while, I really wanted them to stop trying to be a team and kick Huntress out already, since they couldnt get along.
