Like a solid action movie ruined by an awful villain.By Jeff FThis volume collects the final issues of the build-up to No Man's Land; if you read the No Man's Land trades a few years back and wondered how exactly Gotham City became cut off from the USA, here's your answer. As a story, it's a

mixed bag. There's a lot to like, such as the issue where Bruce Wayne makes a speech to Congress, punctuated by several splash pages of key moments in Batman history, all illustrated by Jim Aparo; there's also a great, horror-themed 3-part story about the inmates of Arkham Asylum. However, the main villain of these stories is Nick Scratch, a Satanic-themed rock star who's part David Bowie, part Ozzy Osborne, and is able to influence public opinion against Gotham City. That would've even been too ridiculous for the 1966 Batman show; as a character, Scratch doesn't make much sense and plain doesn't work. About the Author Dennis O'Neil began his career as a comic-book writer in 1965 at Charlton, where then-editor Dick Giordano assigned him to several features. When Giordano moved to DC, O'Neil soon followed. At DC, O'Neil scripted several series for Giordano and Julius Schwartz, quickly becoming one of the most respected writers in comics. O'Neil earned a reputation for being able to "revamp" such characters as Superman, Green Lantern, Captain Marvel -- and Batman, whom O'Neil (with the help of Neal Adams and Giordano) brought back to his roots as a dark, mysterious, gothic avenger. Besides being the most important Batman writer of the 1970s, O'Neil served as an editor at both Marvel and DC. After a long tenure as Group Editor of the Batman line of titles, he retired to write full-time.
