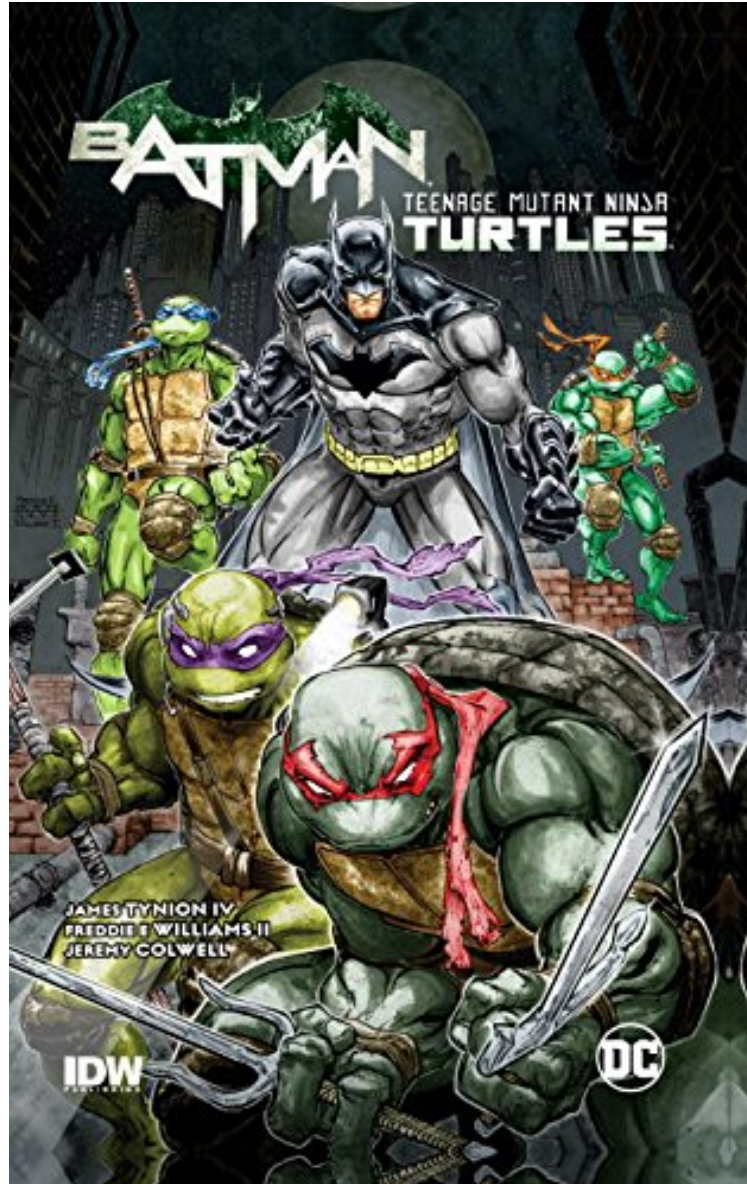

interesting setup: The turtles and Shredder and the foot clan have arrived in Batman's world somehow. There is the obligatory super hero misunderstanding fight, which is great, because of course we want to see Batman fight the turtles. But they get their issues sorted out and team up on Shredder. A good number of Batman villains make an appearance in this including Killer Croc, Penguin and more. We get most of the main characters from both franchise to make at least a brief appearance, but the meat of the story is Batman, the Turtles and Shredder. We even get a one on one Batman/Shredder fight! I mean what else do I have to say? This should already be in your cart. I took off a star because the story wraps up too quickly and simply. I feel like they could have gotten more out of the twist with the Batman villains towards the end than they did. I also was torn on the art of Freddie Williams II. I liked the way he drew almost everything in the book....except Batman. His Batman just didn't do it for me. He looked a little too much like a bad 90's stereotype (as in too muscular, poor detail and linework) but I thought everyone else he drew looked great. After the story there are a ton of pages of all the various alternate cover that graced this series, and those were fun to look at. My personal favorite was a Neal Adams drawing of Batman and the Turtles, followed closely by a Gabriel D'Otto work. But there were a ton of cool covers to look at and I'm really glad they were included at full size.

Wood As if the TMNT meeting up with the Ghostbusters wasn't awesome enough, now they find themselves stranded in Gotham City, along with Master Splinter this time, following a battle with General Krang after getting blasted with his portal projector. It seems that Splinter and the turtles' problems are doubled this time too: for one, there is no known substance in the DC universe that bears a resemblance to the mutagen that transformed them which is causing the mutagen in their blood to deteriorate and become inept. Once that happens Splinter and the turtles will revert back to their base animal forms and lose their humanity forever. If that wasn't bad enough Shredder and a small number of his Foot ninja have been sent to Gotham as well and he teams up with two of Gotham's greatest villains, first The Penguin (who Shredder finds to be quite laughable) and later with Ras' Al Ghul, effectively forming an alliance between the Foot Clan and the League Of Assassins. I know, right? What exactly is Ras' and Shredder's plan you ask? First Shredder will wait patiently until Splinter and the turtles revert to their base forms and, quite literally, crush the life out of them while he and Ras' claim Gotham as the new seat of their shared empire using a newly constructed portal machine in Gotham to bring in more Foot ninja to fill out their numbers. They also trick the turtles' buddy Casey Jones into delivering a fresh batch of mutagen to Gotham under the assumption that it will be used to help Splinter and the turtles, only for the two arch villains take it away from him to use on the inmates of Arkham Asylum as a way to kick start their plan. There is only one man who can help set things straight now, although this may be difficult for Batman as well, even with help from Robin (Damien), especially with the time constraint. This is one of the best cross overs I have seen in a while and was excited to read it being a fan of both Batman and TMNT. I have also heard that an animated version is rumored to be in the works so keep your fingers crossed. Definitely recommended for fans of either universe, or like me, both universes.

Freddie Williams II, after this series, has become my favourite Turtles artist (he is currently doing the covers for TMNT Universe) and Tynion is one of my favourite Batman writers (although as big of a fan as he is of the character, I wish he would have used Tim instead of Damian in the Robin role here--especially since it was out of continuity). All of the Turtles are showcased and the ninja aspect fits in so well with the Gotham setting. There were also lighthearted moments like Michaelangelo and Donatello's reaction to the Batcave... I also like how they incorporated other characters like most of Batman's rogues and even Splinter and Casey Jones from TMNT. Even if you don't like the story it's worth it to see Shredder and Batman face off and Batman sparring with Leonardo. Great book. I SO hope they do a sequel--they definitely had the sales numbers..! Pick this up now!
