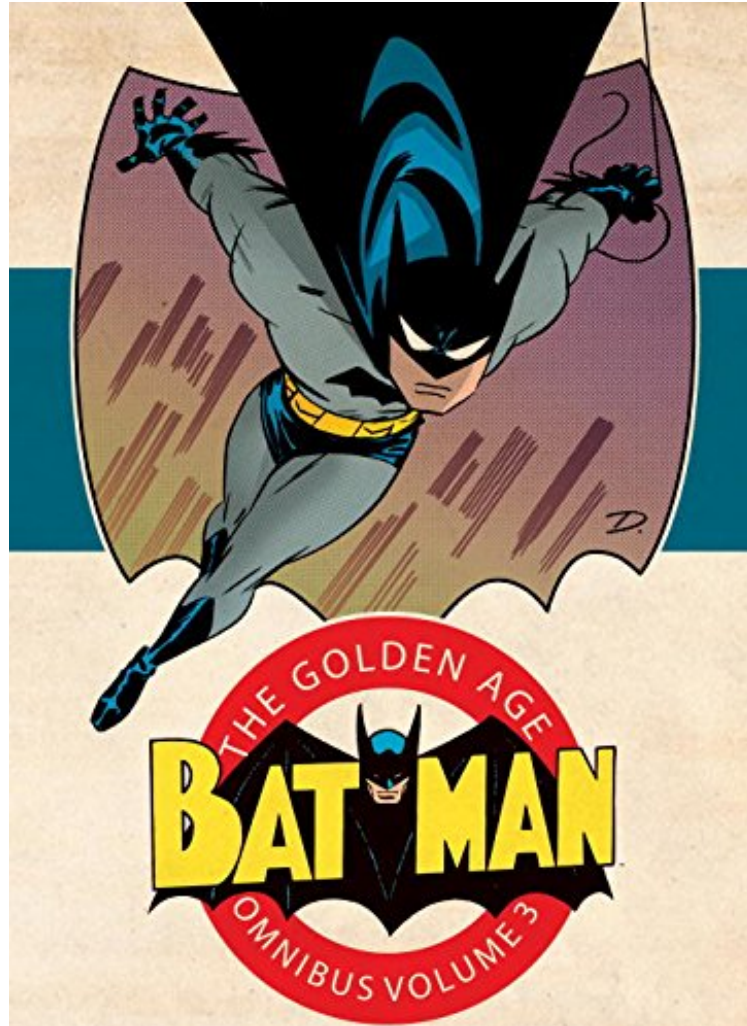

The Premier Golden Age Batman ReprintsBy David SwanOnly three volumes in and the Golden Age Batman Omnibus has already exceeded the material from the 11 volume Batman Chronicles. Chronicles ended with Detective Comics #85, Batman #21 and Worlds Finest Comics #12. This volume, which spans April 1943 to October 1944, reaches issue #92 of Detective Comics, #25 of Batman comics and #14 of Worlds Finest. It should take a couple more Omnibus volumes to pass up the Batman Archives and perhaps three more to exceed Detective Comics Archives. The fourth Omnibus is already scheduled to be released in November so it appears as if DC might be serious about completing the Golden Age this time around.For me the Omnibus editions are

the crime de la crime of Golden Age Batman reprints. The page quality is about equal to the Archive editions and far superior to Chronicles editions. The physical size of the Omnibus books is larger at 9 by 6.5 as opposed to 8 by 6 for the Archive and Chronicles and the volume of material per book is much higher. Volume 3 checks in at a hefty 780 pages. You get A LOT for your moneys worth. The Omnibus editions also have some lovely covers by the late Darwyn Cooke so they are, in my opinion, the most attractive Golden Age collection yet. My biggest issue with the Omnibus editions is that it seems like every copy I get has some damage to it. In this case it was wrapped in cellophane and yet still had damage to the dust cover on the top and bottom even under the cellophane. Volume 3 introduces one of the most beloved members of the Batman family, his faithful butler Alfred. The original Alfred is barely recognizable from his modern day self. Hes portly and bald and acts as a comedy relief. He also wasnt the childhood butler of Bruce Wayne but only appears now as the middle age son of the Wayne familys former butler. I have thus far only scratched the surface of this volume but I will update my review as I continue through it.
