series, but thankfully readers don't have to in order to follow the Trial of Jean Grey. There's just enough recap to set the stage and then the action begins. Jean Grey and the other founding X-Men were brought from the past into the Marvel Now Present. When the Shi'ar learn of her presence on Earth, they decide to put her on trial for the genocides committed by her as the Phoenix Force crimes she hasn't committed yet! The Guardians stumble upon the plot and decide to intervene. They arrive on Earth too late to stop her abduction, but are in hot pursuit with the remaining out-of-time X-Men. This story was non-stop from the first page until the last. There are several battle sequences (and I am really loving Angela!) between the Guardians and various foes until they reach the Shi'ar Throne World. Where Quill's Father, the King of Spartax, has surprisingly put forth a defense of Jean. At first, I didn't like J'Son; he seemed just an arrogant King determined to bring his son in line. However, he has become such an enigma, with a hidden agenda that is not easily discerned by readers or Star-Lord, that he has suddenly become interesting. Plus, Jean goes through some startling changes and one team member makes an unexpected choice that will have repercussions for the future. Overall, this was an excellent volume that has heightened my interest in continuing the GOTG series. I really like the intergalactic politics that help set it apart from the Avengers and the characters are all interesting. Highly recommended!

I read the original Phoenix storyline from the 80's and it was great seeing the old (the Imperial Guard and Starjammers) meet the new (All-New Original X-Men and new Guardians of the Galaxy). The reasoning is a little bit of a reach, but any excuse to get so many colorful characters together is worth checking out. It does not disappoint. Immonen and Piccheli's similar art style really makes the book flow and visually pop. I hadn't read any of the new Guardians of the Galaxy books...I will now because of the quality of the art. I already really liked All New X-Men. The only thing I've noticed about a lot of the newer books is the fight scenes are a lot shorter. A couple melee shots followed by one big impact page and then it's over followed by a lot of dialogue. Sometimes all you see is the aftermath. A little more action please. Overall, worth the checking out.
