The spirited Guardians bring the fun in their back and forth banter. By THowerton Brian Michael Bendis sometimes manages to do what often gets missed in superhero comics she brings the fun. Hes got a knack for writing team books and balancing disparate personalities. This relatively new iteration of the ever-changing GOTG adds a more earth-bound flavor to the cosmic capers by including among their ranks Kitty Pryde (of X-Men infamy, currently Peter Quill/ Starlords love interest), Ben Grimm/ the Thing (of Fantastic Four fame, still ever-lovin and blue-eyed), and Flash Thompson who I believe goes by the tag Agent Venom (both of whom were thorns in Peter Parker/ Spider-mans side). The Civil War II tie-in is strong with this one. The GOTG are off in deep space when they get a request from Captain Marvel to come help out with some issues on earth that are brewing between she and Iron Man. She wants to use and act on precognitive intelligence that shes getting from an Inhuman to stop threats on and to earth while Tony Stark believes that they cant trust, shouldnt trust the info and act on pre-determined guilt. Captain Marvel enlists the GOTG to help her, er, beat some sense into Iron Man and the heroes that have sided with him. It doesnt quite go as planned and the GOTGs ship gets blasted in the battle and now theyre stuck on earth. The whole affair is lively but surprisingly light on the superhero battle action. Bendis instead opts to focus on the character interplays and their personalities. Smart choice. That is what makes this whole affair pretty fun to read. In the hardcover trade edition at least theres a lot of extra bonus pages that show off the pencils and then the bw inks. Its kinda cool but they didnt need as many as they put in.
