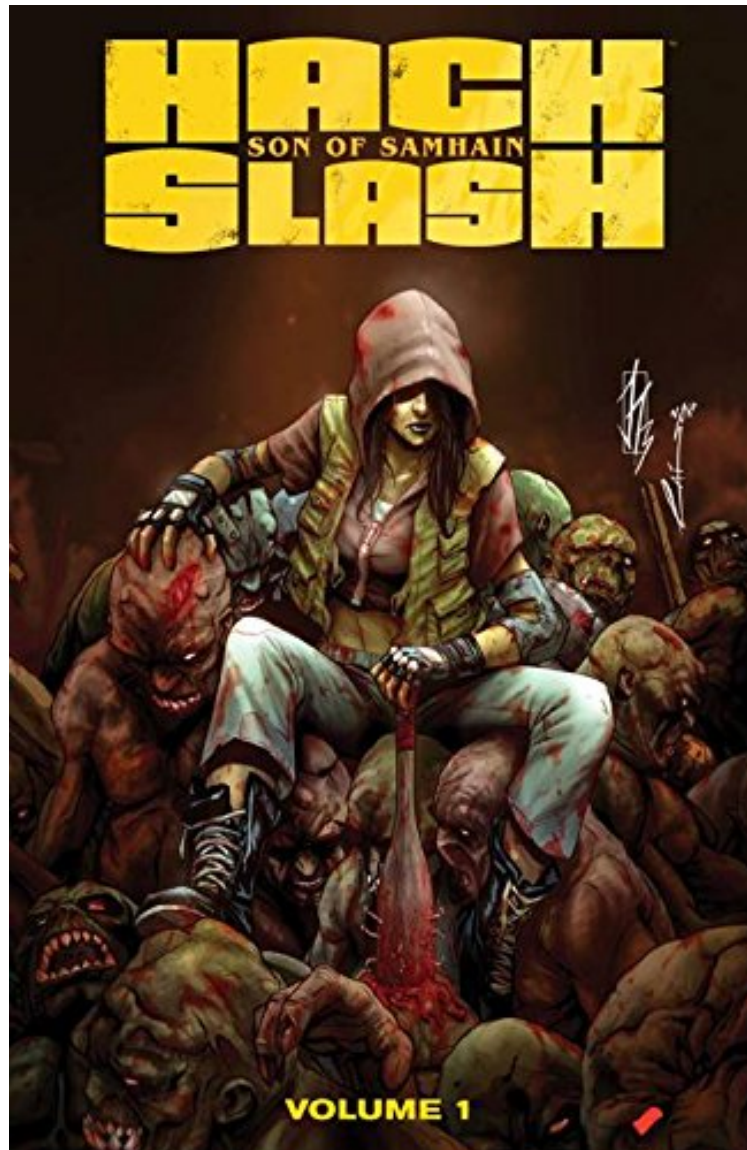

The story kind of fits with what Cassandra did in the previous series but it didn't totally feel right which is not a surprise since Tim Seeley (currently the writer of DC's Nightwing) wasn't the one who wrote it. It ends with a cliffhanger, I wouldn't normally care but there's no guarantee we'll get a continuation anytime soon. The Good The artwork is solid all the way through and quite enjoyable to look at. Cassandra's character returns without any ridiculous changes to her personality. The story is ok nothing incredible but for the most part worked for me and was enjoyable. If you're new to Hack/Slash and want a decent feel to what the series main character (Cassandra) is like this is an ok book to pick up, plus the artwork is really good.
