The title was always intriguing to me and the premise, a group of superpowered people hunting down strange occurrences and disproving them, sounded like it would be fun.For some reason the book didn't grab me. From the introductory chapter where the group tracks down a Youtube video of a 1960's era astronaut suit being piloted by a

bunch of crows, this story just seemed like it was lacking. After the group tracks down the astronaut suit, named Murder BTW (get it, a MURDER of crows!?!), he says he wants to join the team. Just like that. The book seems like it wants to be good, but it just misses getting there. I feel like the mysteries all had a little too convenient of a resolution and that the main villain didn't seem like much of a threat. The one promising villain turns out to be something that can go between worlds but doesn't want to do anything more than play tag. The art is decent. It kind of gives the book a sort of campy feel. I think it wants to be more of a serious book, but the art keeps it from achieving that goal. The last chapter or two is drawn by a different artist who delivers on the more serious tone. However, this story is the one that is a little lighter than the main story. I may or may not pick up the second trade.
