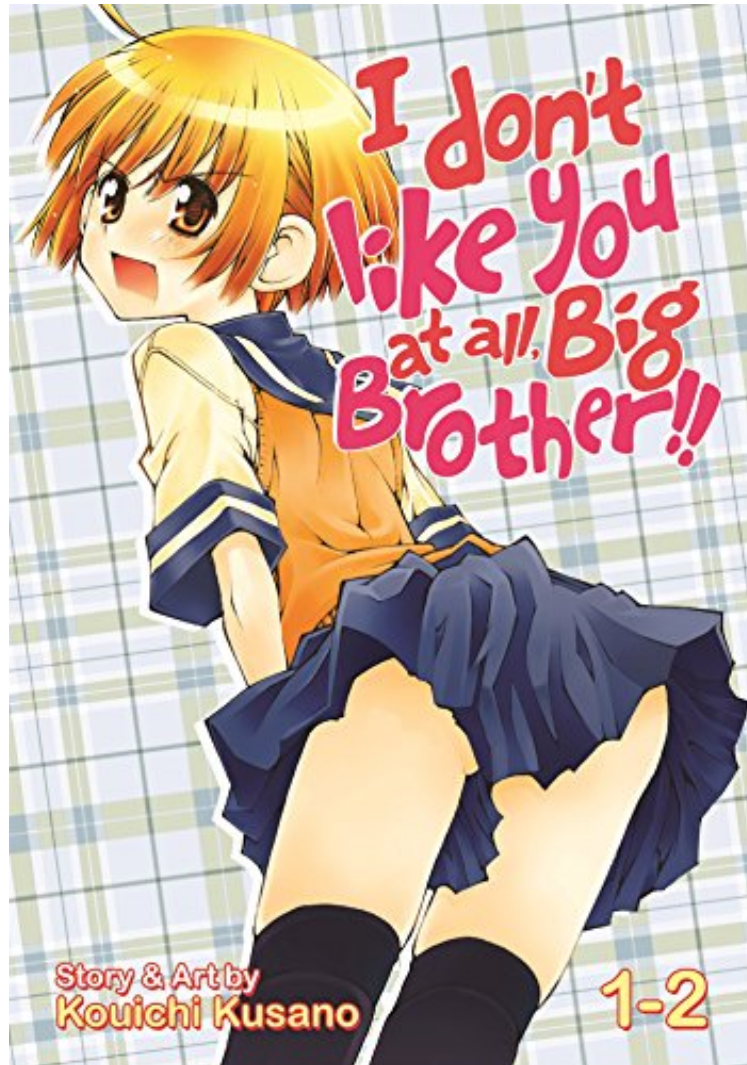

"I Don't Like You At All, Onii-Chan!!"By T.NAKAJIMA[The review includes some minor spoilers.]Kouichi Kusano's comedy "I Don't Like You At All, Big Brother!!" centers on a spirited girl Nao Takanashi in her first year of high school. And she really likes her brother, a high school sophomore Shuusuke Takanashi. She likes him so much that she secretly plays her onii-chan's alto recorder. She also knows everything about her big brother, even keeps a "big bother observation diary."But her big brother starts acting strangely, when Shuusuke's pigtailed childhood friend Iroha Tsuchiura comes back to the town after ten years. And

Iroha is also interested in Nao's big brother, only more aggressively so. At first sight, the comic seems flirting with the risk in telling the story of a young girl romantically (and alarmingly) attracted to her own "big brother." In fact, Nao and Shuusuke are not related by blood. To make things complicated, both of them know this fact, even though neither of them knows that his/her "sibling" knows the fact. Thus the comic is making fun of conventions in manga/anime/game (especially eroge) storytelling. The result is so silly but fun. This is manga creator Kouichi Kusano's first non-adult comic. I must say to some readers Kusano's artwork is an acquired taste. With a career that spans nearly ten years in adult comics, Kusano knows what he is doing, when he draws the girls' bodies to be impossibly skinny. Of course, he can draw the body in correct proportion. The point is, for all the panty shots, this is a comedy, something not to be taken seriously. Unlike many Japanese rom-com manga titles translated in English (including "Toradora," "Haganai" and many others), "Big Brother" does not come from a light novel origin. The on-going comic started its serialization in 2008 on a free web comic magazine "Web Comic High!" (now "Web Comic Action!") by Futabasha. The panel layout is sometimes awkward, but the heroines are all attractive and what they do is nothing short of unpredictable.
