The introduction to the new Inhumans has felt fresh and organic. Not forced like some mutants have been over in X-Men the last few years. However, what really wins this volume hands down is the drama with Maximus and Blackbolt.

These brothers have been back and forth from brothers to the worst of enemies and as we have seen with Maximus. He has returned to his more sinister side but it finally catches up with him after all this time and its very fitting. The biggest part is the rejection by Blackbolt which he finally does here. The Axis tie ins are nice because it shows a very dark side of Medusa that hasn't been seen in years. While volume 3 will explain the aftermath this summer, this volume is a must have for new and old readers alike.

Previously in Inhuman Volume 1: Genesis the Inhumans were situated in the Hudson River opposite Manhattan and offered refuge to an increasing number of NuHumans who were transforming as the Terrigen Mist swept the globe. The current volume ties the Inhumans to line-wide events in the Marvel universe. The Inhuman tie-in to Avengers X-Men: Axis also closely references events unfolding in Avengers: Time Runs Out Volume 1. Readers will want to be aware of events in Marvel's larger events in order to understand everything that is happening in this book.

In this book, the leadership of Attilan is rocked to its foundation. Without Black Bolt, Medusa is queen of the Inhuman community. Her already haughty nature is exacerbated by events on Genosha. But it turns out that Inhumans and Humans alike can only put up with so much! While things are falling apart at the Inhuman home, writer Charles Soule weaves two additional story threads. Medusa's top detectives are on the trail of Black Bolt and Maximus, and Reader's attempt to rescue Iso may bring war to the Inhumans too soon. While there is a lot going on this book, and while it is nice to see the Inhumans more closely tied to big events, a lot about this book felt like it had been done before. An island fortress in the harbor of a major human city...new superhumans with untried powers popping up randomly across the globe...I had a lot of deja vu with previous stories from the X-Men. Moreover, the Axis crossover just didn't work. The Inversion spell brings out the opposite in characters. Deadpool turns zen, Evan turns into Apocalypse, but here an already aloof Medusa seems to become impossibly imperious. Finally if you're not "up to speed" with the Time Runs Out story in the Avengers, the plot thread in this book involving Black Bolt and Maximus is fairly difficult to understand.

Soule has a tall order in turning the Inhumans into the next big thing. For this reader, it seems like the Inhuman royalty were cut from the same mold as Namor. It may take making the Inhumans a bit more human to make them more likeable characters. I bought this book because I generally love a Marvel event. Axis was good, but this tie-in felt forced. Readers following the Avengers, however, will be more rewarded by the connection to the events leading up to the franchise shattering Secret Wars

This book starts with the strongest part of the issue as Maximus plays with Black Bolt like he is a puppet. Inhuman cops are sent out to find Black Bolt only to discover he is in Max's clutches. The conclusion with Black Bolt and Maximus results in an injury that isn't mentioned again despite the fact it should've been. After those events we pick up with The Reader and find out why he picked up Xiaoyi in the last issue, the reasons being Han Solo-ish mixed with the upcoming movie Self/less. The final part of the issue deals with Queen Medusa now into SM ready to do some dirty deeds (make sure you check out the AXIS event so you will only be a little confused and not totally). By the end all three stories come together to lead into Volume 3.

Much like Volume 1 the art switches at the midway point of the book. I felt that Stegman (who picks up at the midway point) was once again the weaker of the two but that was more due to Pepe Larraz having a style I really enjoyed. The expressiveness of the faces from Larraz was standout.

Thought dead by most of the world since INFINITY, Inhuman king Black Bolt steps back into the spotlight! Black Bolt and Maximus have been secretly involved with the New Avengers' activities for months now, but that's not even close to the whole story of their absence. The Boltagon brothers are in trouble - and it's going to end very badly for one of them! Meanwhile, Medusa's inversion thanks to the events of AXIS is making her a very different ruler of Attilan!
