I now own all of the Invincible Ultimate Collection editions. I have been buying them as they have been released, and normally I can patiently wait the year or so between releases. This time, however, it was very hard to wait. I knew that this book was going to contain the climax of the book. Not the climax of a story arc, mind you, but the climax of the entire series! Ever since the first story arc, things have been building towards this event - the big showdown between the remnants of the Viltrumite Empire and the Coalition of Planets! That story alone (also contained in the TPB Invincible Volume 14 TP) made this book worth the purchase price. It was everything I had hoped for in a big battle, and the artwork turned in by Ryan Ottley was just fantastic! Loads of action, loads of two-page spreads! Death and sacrifices on both sides! Power unleashed to its fullest! I loved it, and if you've been reading this series at all, so will you!

The second half of this book (which is also collected in the TPB Invincible Volume 15: Get Smart TP), focuses on Invincible's return to Earth and his readjustment to life with Atom Eve, Cecil Steadman, his parents, and the rest of his old friends. Mark also examines his life, thus far, and tries to think of ways to do things better than he's been doing them in the past - i.e. non-violent resolutions to problems. I had mixed feelings about the second half of this book. There were some things I liked, but plenty of things I didn't. Kirkman lets his own feelings on certain political issues show forth in this book, vicariously, through his characters. I could have done without that, as I'm probably a polar opposite to him in my own views on these issues. Also, I know it's been his thing to title all of his TPBs with names of TV shows from the '80's, but I really hope he isn't concocting storylines just to shoehorn them in to fit with available show titles. That's a bit too much of the tail wagging the dog, and this is the first time that I've sort of got the feeling that it might be happening in the book. Regardless of its flaws, this was still a great book, and I'm more than satisfied by the conclusion of The Viltrumite War. I liked the way that Kirkman has left the door open for future confrontations with the lone Viltrumite survivors, and it will be a true test of his writing chops to see if he can make long-time readers sympathetic to these villains that they've grown to scorn for all these years. This collection is the most expensive of the Ultimate Collection editions, but it's also the largest since the very first one. The book contains 14 issues, and one of those single issues had extra content in it, I believe, so you can accept the increase in cover price. If you're like me, you'll probably want to find a quiet place and read the whole thing through in one sitting, anyway, so give yourself some time to enjoy it to the fullest extent. Really, if you're a fan of the character, I can't imagine you not loving this book! The sketch book at the end of the book was as cool as ever, too. This is a book that I give the highest recommendation to!
