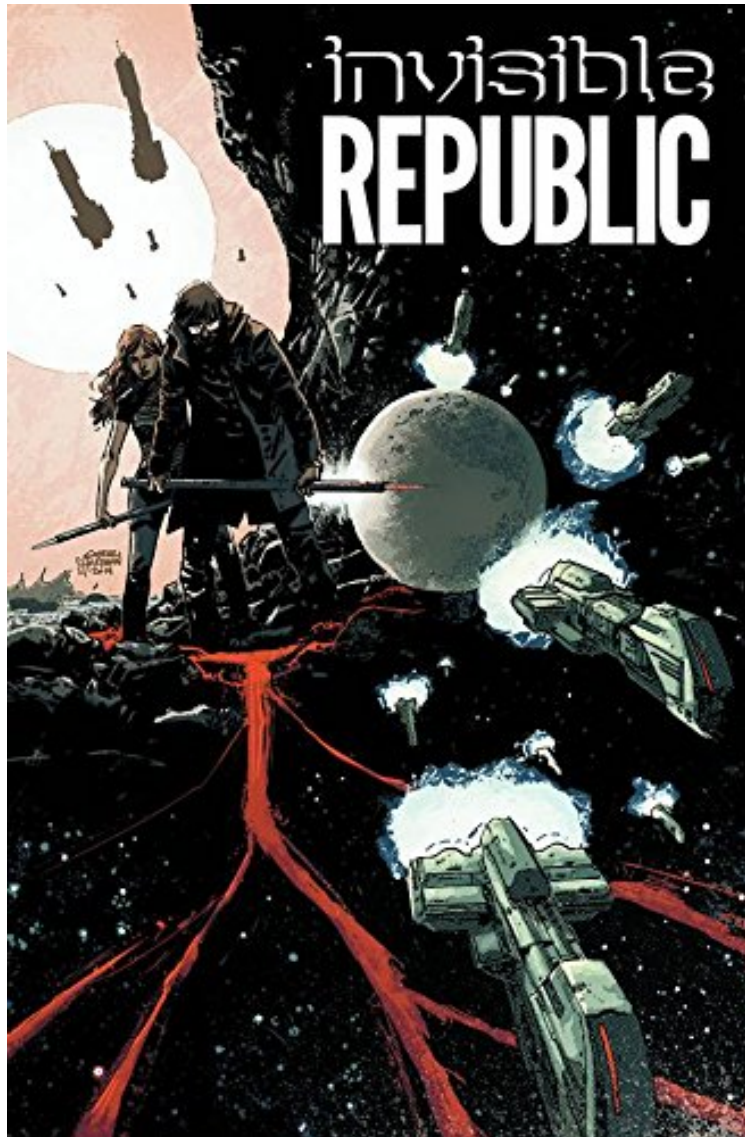

Avalon is in a system involving a few other worlds/moons, but is inhabited by people from Earth.The story is told in a

series of current scenes and historical flashbacks. The flashbacks concern the origin of Arthur McBride and his rise from runaway indentured servant/farm worker to the face and then leader of the revolution that seized power and ruled Avalon with a harsh fist. Other characters involve McBride's cousin Maia, a couple of journalists and a number of revolutionaries from the past.
