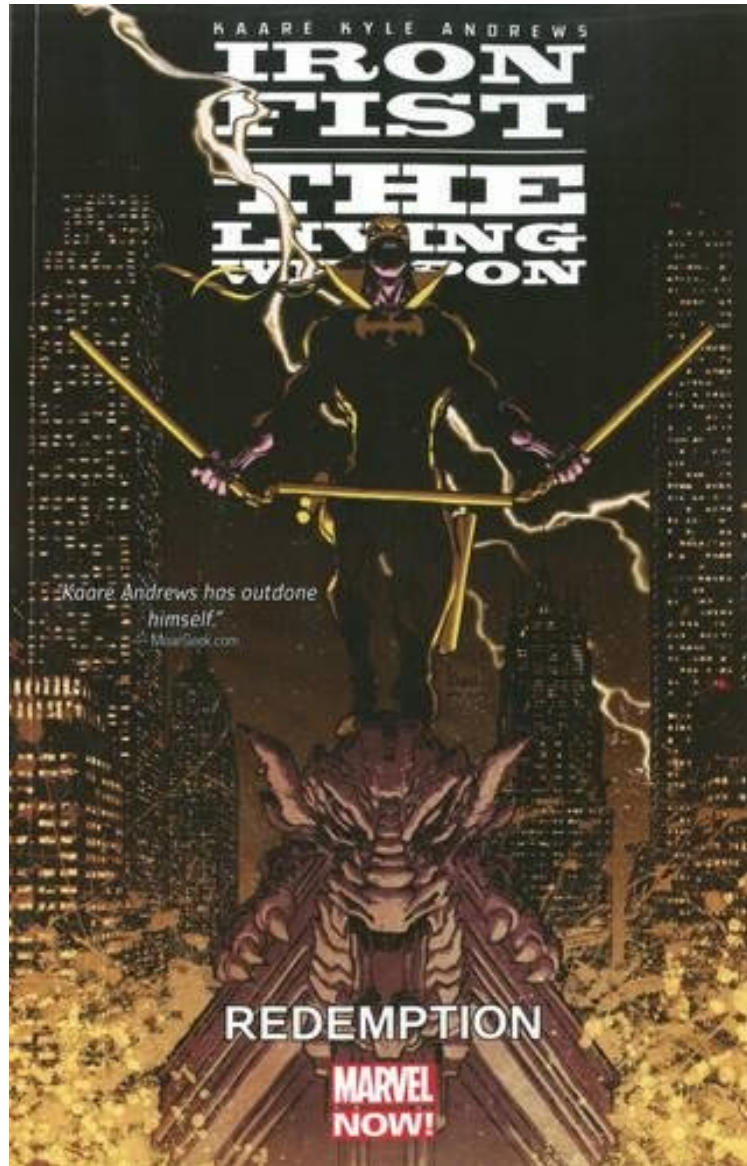

A nice finish to a good series By JonnieSparko If you're buying this book, I can only imagine you've read Volume 1, Rage. I will quote some of my review from book one, as it is pertinent here. Andrews has a unique artistic style in comics, almost cartoony, but dark as noir comics. The colors palette is limited to what he needs to show you an image, and brightness is just about thrown out the window in his studio. On occasion, he's using two tones for multiple panels or pages. I can see how this might bother someone who's used to seeing a multicolored piece of work, various colors being used to describe what this mythical/fantastic characters worlds might look like, but if you give it time, I think you'll like what Andrews has done here. The cast is also limited, but you don't need a big collection of characters to tell this story. The book builds on the past, and explores the cracks that could be perceived in the origin written years before. Andrews explores what might be Iron Fists motivations, his fears, and it makes for an interesting story. He really takes Fist on a journey here, and this book, volume two, will pick up right where volume one left off. The book is full of action, surprises, and it's unlike most books out right now. This series has not been my favorite take on Iron Fist, but it's definitely worth a read.
