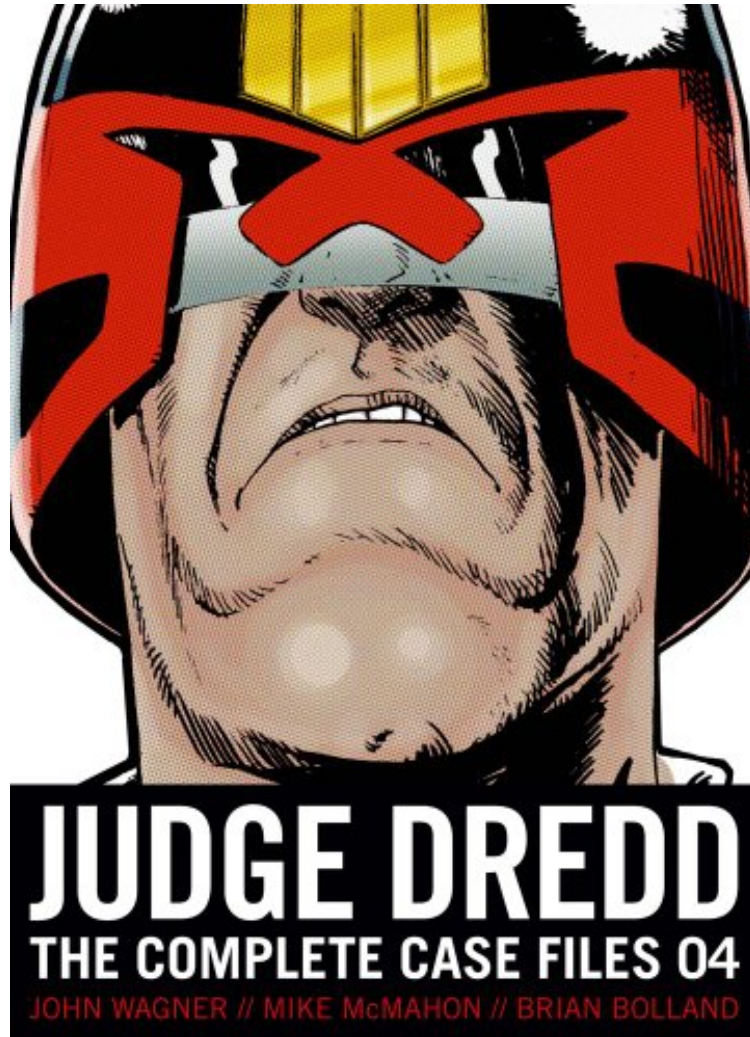

Finstock I've been interested in Dredd for awhile, but it was very expensive to get books here in the States. These are great, they show almost every Dredd story, inexpensively, in black and white. See what all the fuss is about. My only issue with this collection is that it doesn't follow the conventions of the other volumes released so far. This is the only black cover so far, and the 2000AD stamp on the spine is about an inch higher than in the previous and subsequent volumes, so it looks a tad awkward on a shelf. That being said, these are giant volumes of comic books, so they're going to be awkward on any shelf, regardless of how they are bound.
