This is a great series, especially if you like elseworld type stories or just aren't feeling the overly serious and self important new 52 justice league. My personal favorite of this version of the league is superman, who has none of the humility or tact of superman. I especially enjoyed his forgetting he can't fly and his frankly boorish attempts to hit on wonder woman, who here lacks any of the compassion you would expect. So now onto the big negative, which is not a fault of the series but a strange decision on the part of DC. The last two issues of the book, 14 and 15, are missing. So there is a bit of a cliffhanger, but the bigger problem is that there can't be a third issue to squeeze these into. Dc made a similar issue collecting Batwing, but it is worse here. There is a sequel series, 3001, so I assume they will be included there. Now, when I bought the volume the description went to 13 I think, so it is possible there is a new edition of volume 2 that includes these issues. Judging by the other reviews though, that is not the case.
