from June 1963 to September 1964 written by Gardner Fox and illustrated by Mike Sekowsky. Thus, the tone, the artwork, and the plots don't vary from the previous years. This is, however, the era when Fox resurrects the Justice Society of America and opens imaginary grounds with his Earth 2 (Crisis on Earth One and Crisis on Earth Two, #s 21 and 22) where DC superheroes were older than heroes on Earth 1 and had different identities. I recall that this Earth 2 and Earth 3 concept was fun to me back then because it gave room for more superheroes. Interestingly enough, an Earth 3 is also added in these tales (Crisis on Earth Three and The Most Dangerous Earth of All, #s 29 and 30). Fox will even suggest that many more Earths may exist in different dimensions. Thus, Fox begins with the JSA yearly appearances in the JLA comics. Several of the older foes reappear in these issues, some apocalyptic threats, and battles against villains take place during this period.
