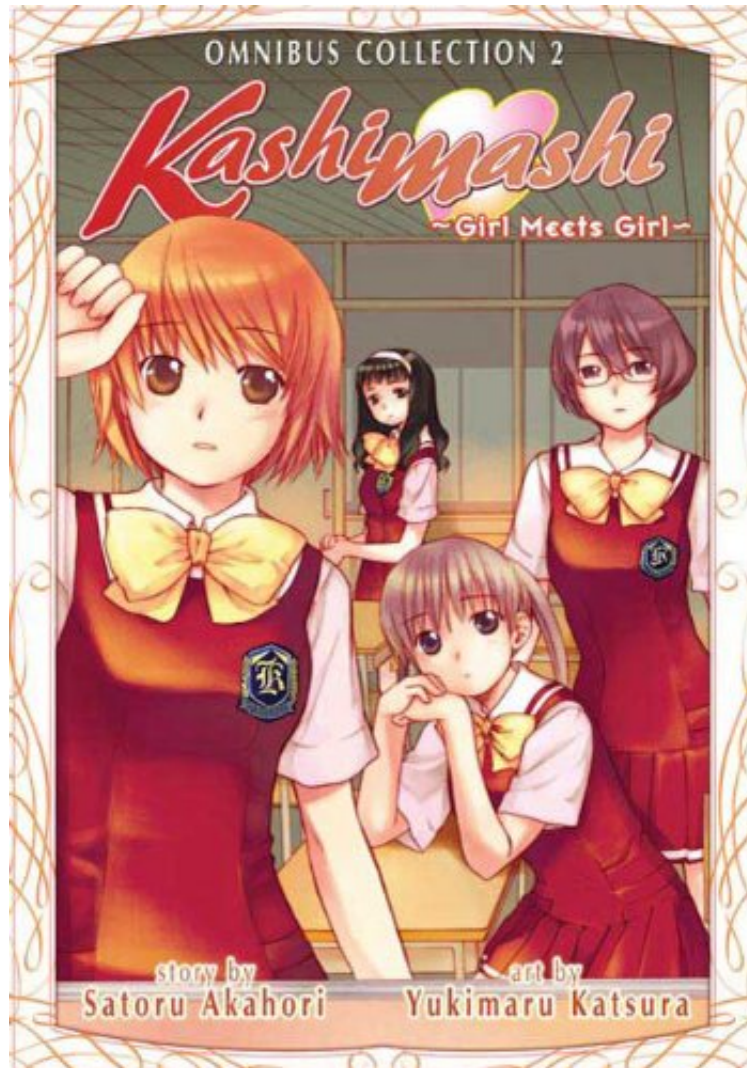

Thus begins

an emotional downward spiral. What would a person do in this situation? Would you tell the people you loved that they would never see you again after 30 days or would you protect their feelings and not tell them? Would you live life to the fullest, go about normally or hole up waiting for your fated destiny? What would you do if you learned your dearest friend had only 30 days to live? Will these questions be answered? Will there be a happy ending? I'm not telling, you'll have to find out for yourself. I have to be honest, this was an emotionally taxing book.
