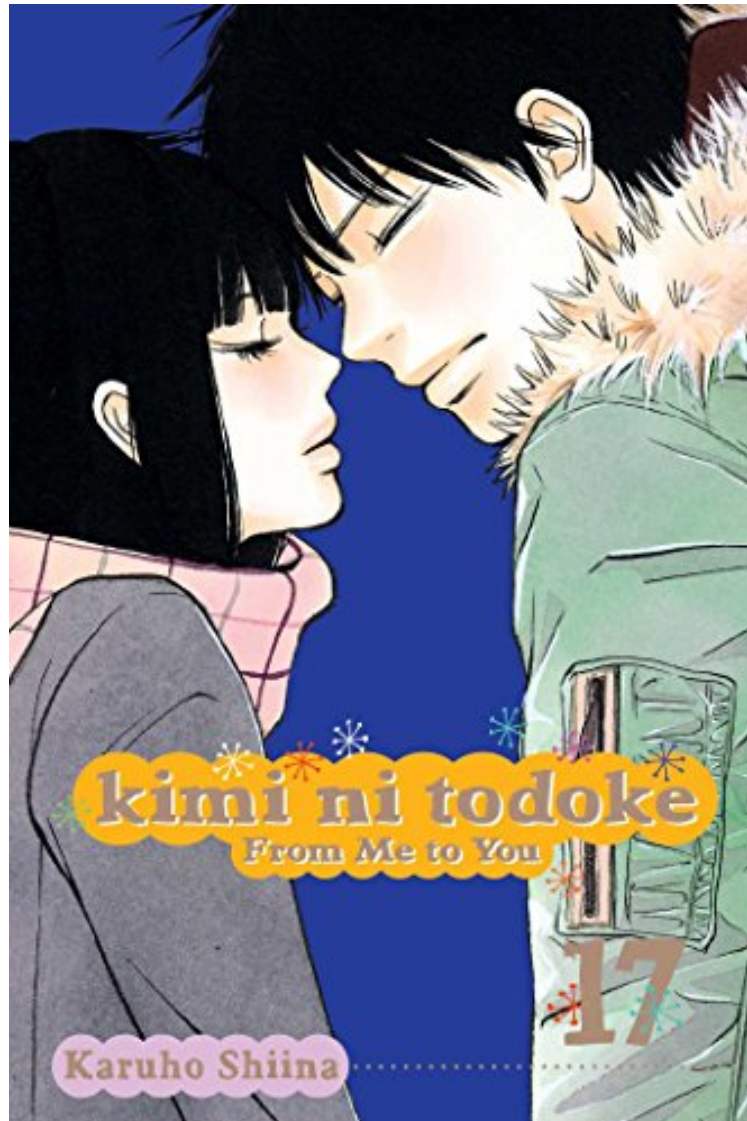

Pin shows up and advises Sawako on her relationship... and Kento confronts Mogi, whom Ayane briefly dated.It was good to see the main couples making progress. We finally get some resolution with the Sawako/Kazehaya situation toward the end, which is sweet (and a relief). Something is happening with Chizu and

Ryu, although it's hard to tell exactly what Chizu's reactions mean. And Kento's actions in this volume are dramatic-- he and Ayane take a big step in this volume. I also loved the scene where Pin talks to Sawako. Actually, I just love Pin-- he's such an idiot, but he can be wise, and he really does care about his students. Actually, I prefer him with Ayane over Kento... Kento's great, too, but I just love her chemistry with Pin.
