The dialogue is good, the art is very nice and there are lots of side adventures that build into the overall arc. The story is told by an aged King Conan (who is far more interesting than young Conan), and he appears at the start of each chapter and a few times throughout the body of the story as well. He is more human, less serious, funny and has acquired a wonderful wisdom from all of his years of fighting and ruling. These have a repeated opening seen where a curious young prince see's a statue of the image of Conan questions his wazir about this man, who must have been a mighty King. The Wazir is reluctant seems a bit bothered by the princes request but goes on to relay the story's. I had collected #0 through #12 and Conan had yet to be crowned King so I new that "The Hour of the Dragon" was indeed a King Conan tale so I purchased it. Remembering how Lancer Ace published this story under the name of "Conan the Conqueror" I figured that was probably the sequel scored with that purchase. In the Dark Horse King Conan graphic Novel's they start the story's off with the aged King Conan remembering past adventure's which worked well for me. They do a great job translating Robert E. Howard's Novella into Graphic Novel form staying true to the spirit of the original. Where I could notice a slight loss in the quality of artwork in the later issues of the "Conan" series, starting to look more like comic book art less like graphic novel art. The artwork "King Conan: the hour of the Dragon" is top quality!!! The world R.E.H. created for Conan to have his adventures in was as detailed as Tolkien's middle earth actually Howard's world was more descriptive more detailed geographically than Tolkien's. Tolkien may have gone into more depth as far as history language Howard wrote adventure and filled his world with steaming jungles, arid deserts violent sea's filled with terrible beast's beautiful city's as well as dirty slums! This is something the movie's always seemed to fail to capture the wide variety of landscape Conan traveled.
