The second crossover, involving the new gods and Darkseid, really needs a sequel. The other two stories are fun, Superman meets Madman, and Superman Tarzan are decent, but the Aliens rule this book.

Bringing together these Man of Steel crossover stories for the first time, Superman faces the universe's deadliest foe, but is he truly strong enough to emerge victorious?
