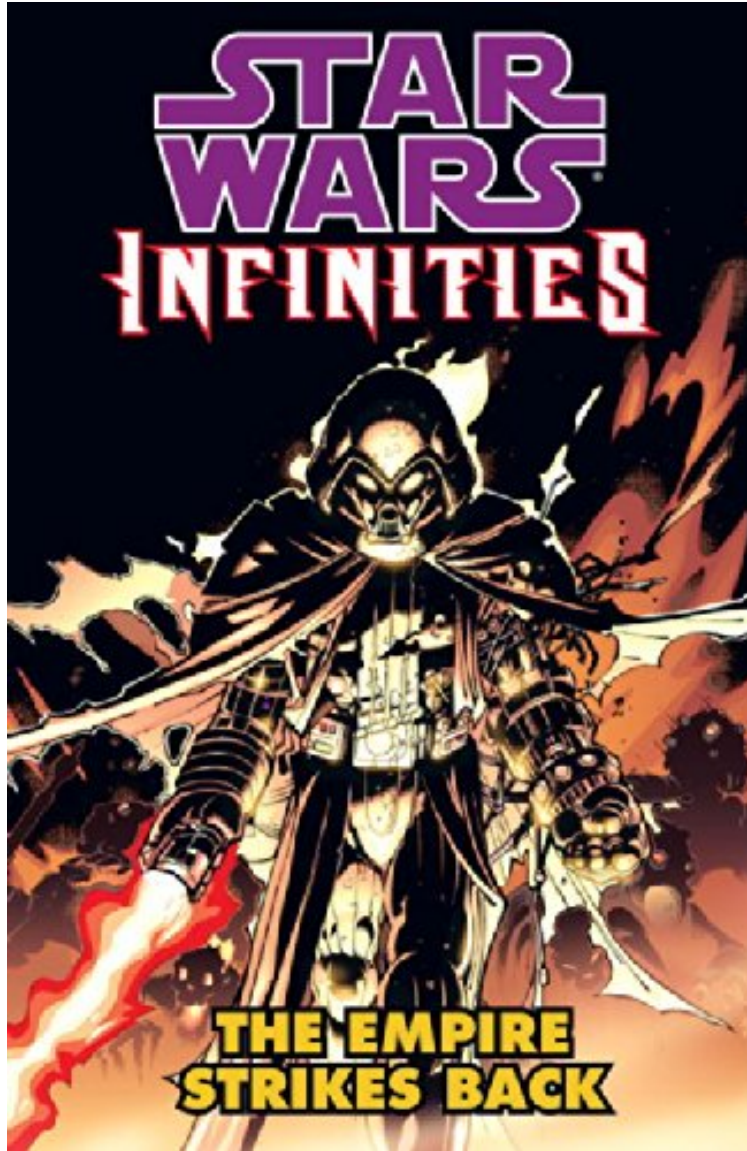

In this case the story is a what-if scenario where Luke dies

at the beginning of Empire Strikes Back. After reading the Infinities version of "A New Hope" I was interested to see how they handled this one. Sadly I was very unsatisfied with this one, it just didn't feel like they finished it properly. This comic feels far too rushed in its execution despite having to cover only two of the movies instead of three. The ending feels far too abrupt and seems to leave too much dangling, as if they ran out of time or space to include a proper ending. The art is nicely done and many of the scenes are well done, it just isn't enough to compensate for the hasty ending.

In the second chapter of the Infinities series, one subtle change is made to the original story of Star Wars Episode V and the storyline is thrown into chaos and a new tale unfolds. Luke Skywalker is on the ice planet Hoth doing a routine sweep of the area when he's attacked by a Wampa and, before his friend Han Solo can save him, he dies in the cold tundra. However, before his death, he reveals to Han that he must head to Dagobah to be trained by Yoda to be a Jedi.

Meanwhile, Darth Vader still hunts to find his son Luke not knowing he has passed and Han, Leia, and Chewie head to Cloud City to meet with Han's friend Lando to repair the Millennium Falcon before heading to Dagobah. However, a bounty hunter named Boba Fett is hot on their trail and, after thwarting one of the best bounty hunters in the galaxy, they meet Yoda and learn that Leia is the chosen one Luke spoke of and not Han. Also, Leia is his sister! Han leaves Leia to train while trying to get the bounty off his head and Vader tracks the group straight to Dagobah after some time and confronts the elderly Jedi Yoda but not before Yoda forces Vader to confront his past and, finally, his own daughter in lightsaber combat. However, it's up to Leia and her friends to save the galaxy from the evil Darth Vader! A fantastic story is told through this alternate timeline and this one is even better than the first Infinities series! The art is very well done and the writing is great! This is definitely a good read if you're into Star Wars at all and it's cheap too!

The big difference in this infinity is that Luke dies on Hoth, leaving Leia to go to Dagobah and become a Jedi. She does, but the story ends in a very unsatisfying way and when one reads it, they'll see why I feel this way. Leia has always been an important character, and after a great build up, well, the reader will see for themselves.

Take the events and characters from one of the classic Star Wars films, throw in one happenstance, mishap, or technical glitch beyond the characters' control, and watch how that changes everything. In Dark Horse's first foray into Infinities (A New Hope), Luke Skywalker's valiant torpedo attack on the Death Star failed due to a faulty detonator an event no one could have foreseen and the Rebellion was dealt a debilitating setback. In Infinities The Empire Strikes Back, Han Solo's desperate attempt to locate his friend Luke in the icy wastes of the planet Hoth is thwarted when the tauntaun he's riding succumbs to the cold while Han is still a mile from Luke's location. Han arrives too late, barely in time to hear Luke's dying words about Jedi training and the planet Dagobah... Thus begins an adventure far different than the one seen in the motion picture. Along the way, a famous bounty hunter is frozen in carbonite, Han and Chewie are captured on Tatooine by Jabba the Hutt, and Princess Leia and Yoda have a fateful jungle showdown with Darth Vader!
