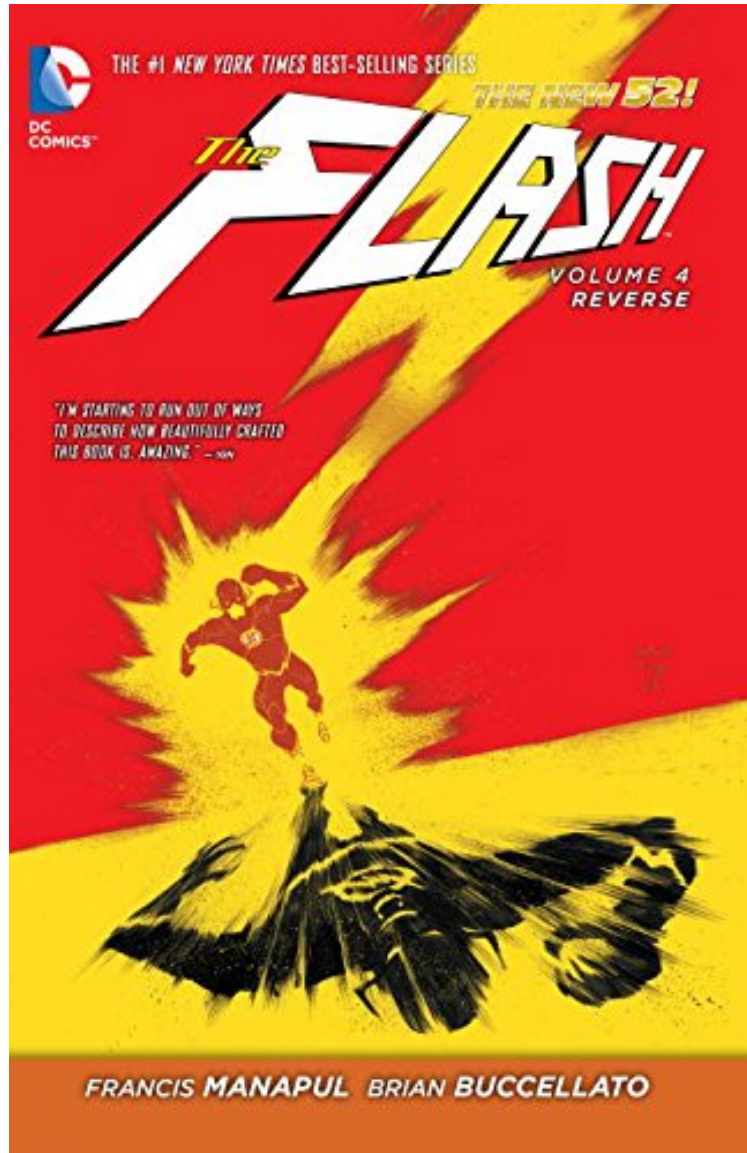

In this volume, someone is going around and killing everyone that was trapped in the Speed Force in the previous volume. The Flash figures this out when only he and Iris West are the only ones

remaining. The Flash first thinks that maybe Kid Flash might be the killer or know something about it since he's another speedster. I liked the interaction they had, and when The Flash realizes Kid Flash can't be who he's looking for, he leaves him alone. The killer, who is called Reverse Flash, is looking to absorb Speed Force energy. He goes to Dr. Elias' laboratory where he has Speed Force stored and starts to absorb it when The Flash appears. This Reverse Flash wants to be able to go back in time to change an event and needs the Speed Force energy to do so. I was surprised to find out who the Reverse Flash was, so I won't spoil it here. We also see Barry Allen moving in with Patty Spivot. Barry seems to be trying to make a normal life outside of being The Flash, which Patty knows. (see last volume of The Flash) At the end of this Volume, we get The Flash Zero Year tie in, which is a Batman storyline that happens six years ago. In this story, we see a rookie Barry Allen in Gotham and his first meeting with Iris West. I also liked how they had Barry working with Harvey Bullock on a case.
