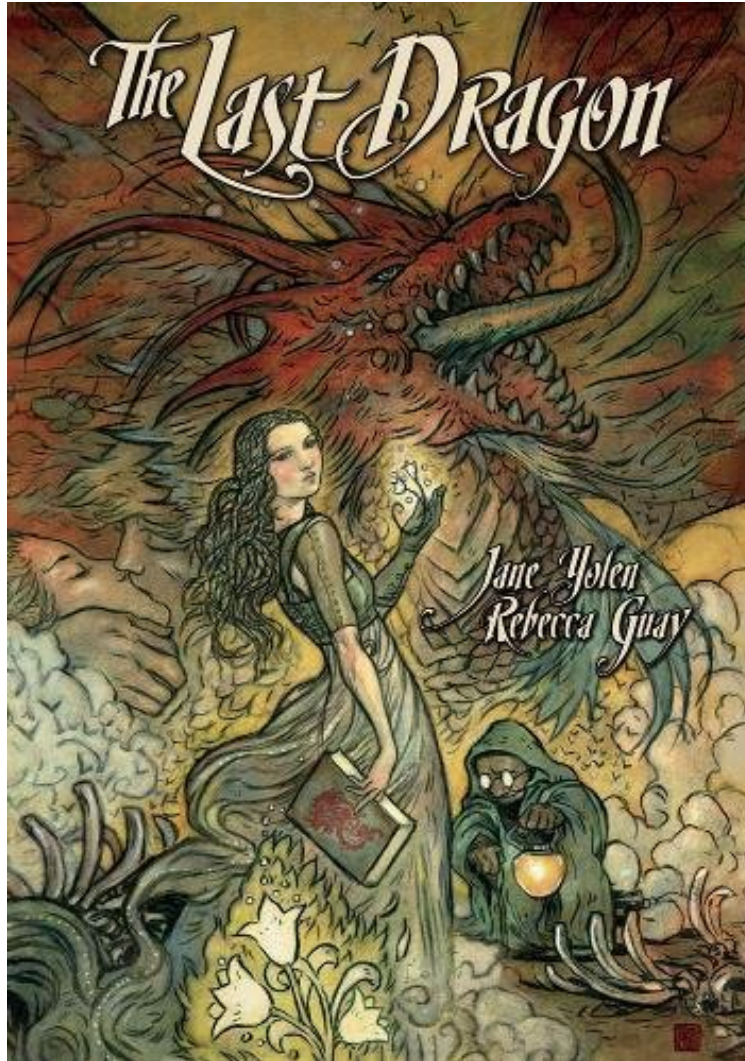

The art early in the book is finely detailed with nuanced color. In these pages the book is gorgeous to look at. Somewhat later, though, the quality noticeably falls off as the line work gets thicker and the backgrounds more bare. At several points the faces look rushed, with eyes misaligned at times, and figures look more sketched than finished. The problem is that this decline in detail and consistency comes at those moments when the story needs the most help from dramatic artwork.0 of 0
