De Liz captures perfectly the core of Diana: she is noble, idealistic, courageous, and above all, sympathetic to the suffering of others, and will do her best to help even if it means sacrificing her own self-interest. The art of the book is also on point: Diana is firmly built, tall, and not sexualized. The s and her friends are also shown to be diverse and unique.
