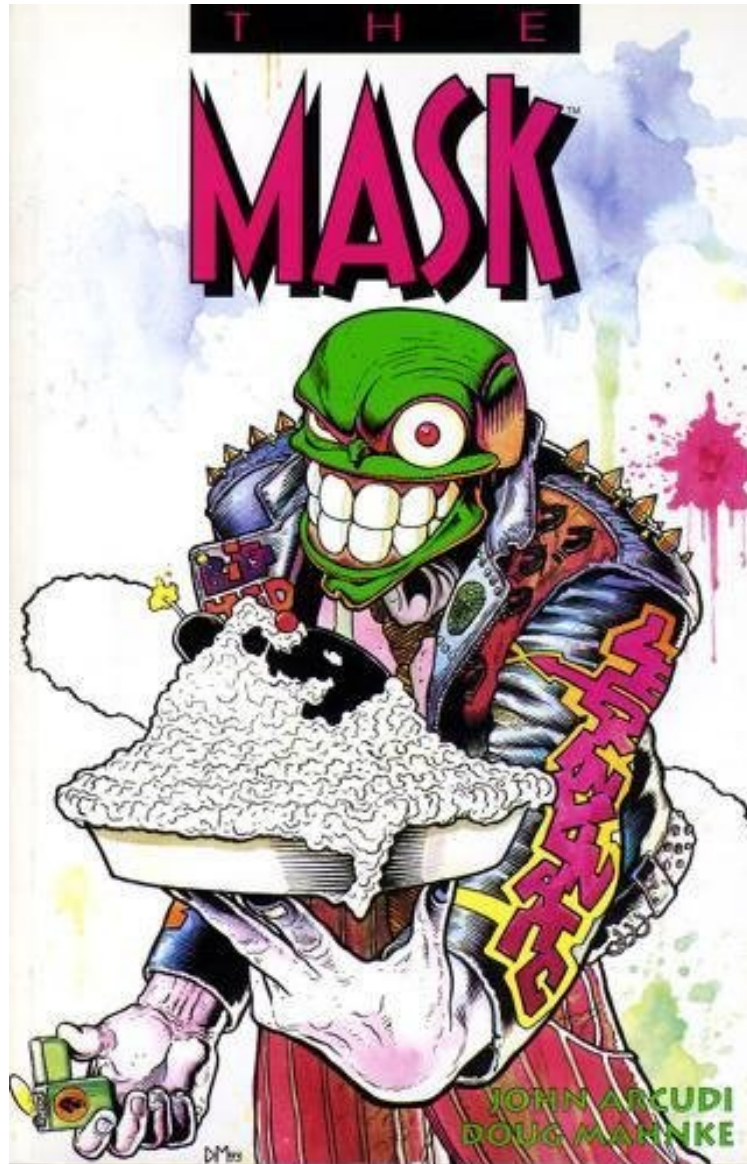

The Mask is grossly drawn. It gives its wearer a big green head, a sinister grin with oversized teeth, and giant eyes. The Mask is drawn with great detail, in order to look intimidating and creepy.
