with true emotions and grit. Even though the creatures are not rendered to look very realistic like the art in *Mouse Guard*, the simple, gritty pen ink style with expressive colors is very effective and draws you in. The artists and writer don't hold back in the fight scenes as limbs and heads are chopped off, and mysteries, riddles, and plot twists abound. Some of the characters are layered with the potential to good or evil. This is a new favorite graphic novel in my collection. If you like fantasy adventures like *Lord of the Rings*, *Chronicles of Narnia* and *Willow and Secret of the Nimh* this is worth checking out.
