thriller. Postal is a great idea for a book and I've enjoyed what I've read of it. The Tithe continues to be an absolute disaster. I like the central conceit of the investigation of religious organizations doing criminal acts. Pretty much anyone who reads the news knows about this stuff. Between Scientology, Islamic Zakat schemes that you see many a Bollywood Star fall prey too, and many other scams and schemes that have been committed over the years by all the other religions, you got plenty of fertile material. Hawkins is a writer in the USA. It makes sense that'd he'd have more of a bent to towards scams ran by Christian churches. Unfortunately, he just makes stuff up like here. None, of what he is describing here in this book has any semblance of reality. I don't want to spoil anything cause again I like the author. However, if you go read the news about German Christmas markets being attacked by truck drivers like other parades in Nice for quite clearly Islamic extremist reasons, you'll realize what an utter shameless, pointless, and slanderous jab at a religion this story arc is.
