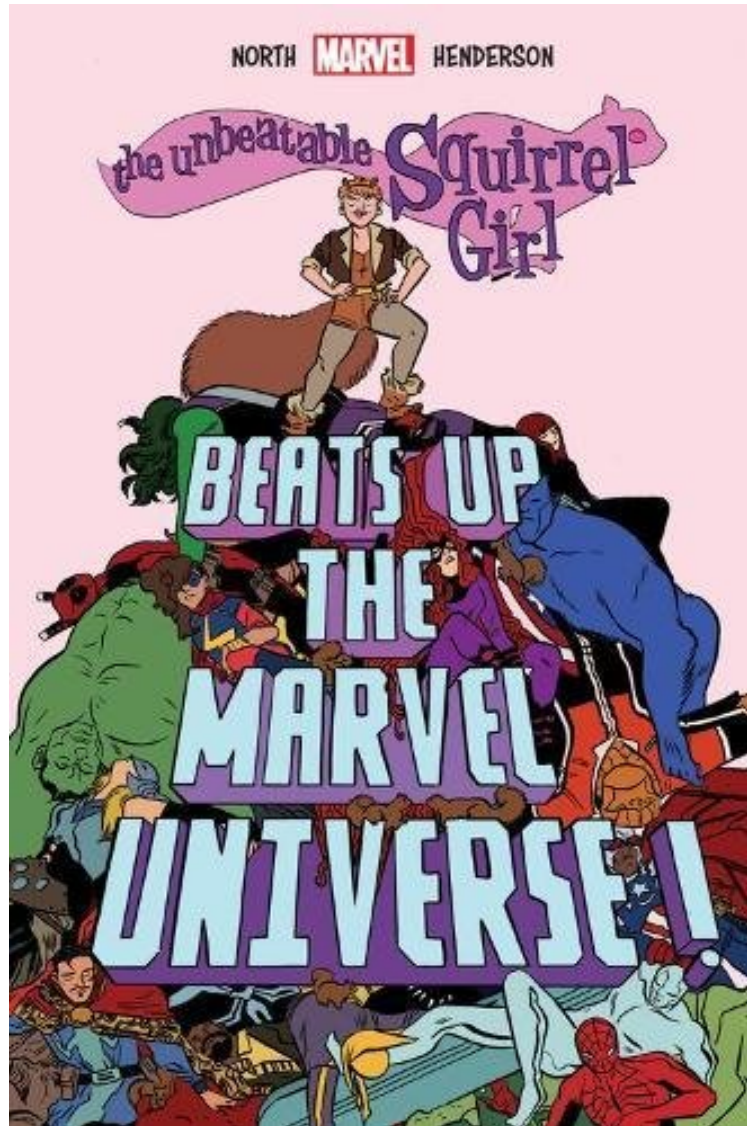

Yes, the press overworked the stock "Super Heroes With Super Problems," but those heroes did good because, by golly, it is the right thing to do. And we readers had fun. Sure, they had problems (usually soap opera problems) but they tried to rise above them. Doreen has her problems too, but she's more well-adjusted than the usual angst-filled Marvel teenager. And like the early Marvel heroes, she's not the most physically heroic looking, she doesn't look like John Romita drew her, and she can be a little cocky at times. But she's still a cutie. Not as cute as Tippy-Toe, but still pretty darned cute. With a great theme song, I must say.
