Misassembled. This was the storyline in which Squirrel Girl transitioned from being the previous kinda-scary hero stalker Iron Man met to the Doreen Green who nannied for the New Avengers and who eventually retconned/evolved into Ryan North's popular character. I'd consider it to be the pivotal storyline that truly launched her Marvel career. Aside from the obvious Squirrel Girl goodness, GLA: Misassembled was a fantastically humorous storyline that sent up the "your favorite hero dies" limited edition miniseries that were rampant at the time by promising a main character would die horribly in each of the four issues. I think it's safe it delivered. One warning is that even though the TPB cover uses the Ryan North SG artwork and the "Unbeatable" bit calls to his run on the series, GLA: Misassembled and thus this book predates Squirrel Girl's youth-oriented focus and is probably not for the younger members of that audience. The deaths are quite graphic and the humor is extremely dark with, among other things, suicide being a major running theme. The "10-13" age range is pretty far off. I'd put it more like 17+. Highly recommended for the GLA mini-series alone, which is hard to find nowadays and a very pleasant surprise to see on Kindle. The extra issues are bonus!
