I loved those issues when I was young, but as an adult....not so much. However, after looking at what came in this book, I decided to

give it a go, which was a great decision. The issues contained in this omnibus are great. It essentially is the beginning of the X-men team that my generation knows and loves. As for the writing and artwork, they are both excellent. Claremont really does a great job redesigning the X-men team and slowly building up the Phoenix story arc. As for the artwork, much of it is done by Byrne, who is becoming one of my favorite artists. His pencil work is great and looks amazing still after almost forty years. As for the book itself. The new Marvel omnibus editions are somewhat different. First, the cover has a different look and feel. I liked the older version's look better, however, the new look doesn't take away from the final product in any way. It still has a sturdy sewn binding and plenty of extras, with my favorite being the letters to the staff. As for the paper quality, it is thinner, however, the ink soaked into it perfectly, and made the artwork look excellent. If you like classic stories and/or Claremont's writing or Byrne's artwork, pick this up. That being said, being able to sit down and read all of them in one collection was a dream come true for me. This volume includes the stories that revitalized the X-Men after they had been all but canceled, and takes them right up to the doorstep of the Dark Phoenix Saga. We get to see relationships develop between Cyclops, Wolverine, Storm, Banshee, Nightcrawler and Colossus, who all went on to become some of the most recognizable characters in comics. You'll see plenty of different villains, including some classic battles with Magneto and Juggernaut and the first appearance of the Shi'ar, Shadow King, Proteus and the Hellfire Club. Anybody who loves the X-Men absolutely must pick this up. I have the two Jim Lee Omnibus collections as well, with the gap in between filled by smaller collections, and this is by far my favorite of the three. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. But I bought this volume and its follow up so I would have the entire series in a volume that would stand next to my Mighty Thor volume by Walt Simonson, and Daredevil by Frank Miller and Fantastic Four by John Byrne. I still like the smaller print version and I'm hanging onto them, but this monster was a joy to open and read. The colors leap off the page in the original registers --bright, bold, and 'happy.' I think some people may see that as a liability. It's true that coloring has come a long way since these books were first published, but Byrne's line work was designed to mute those garish four-color wonders, adding depth with line and ink instead of hue and value. Frankly, . . . I loved it. I can hardly wait for the second volume.
