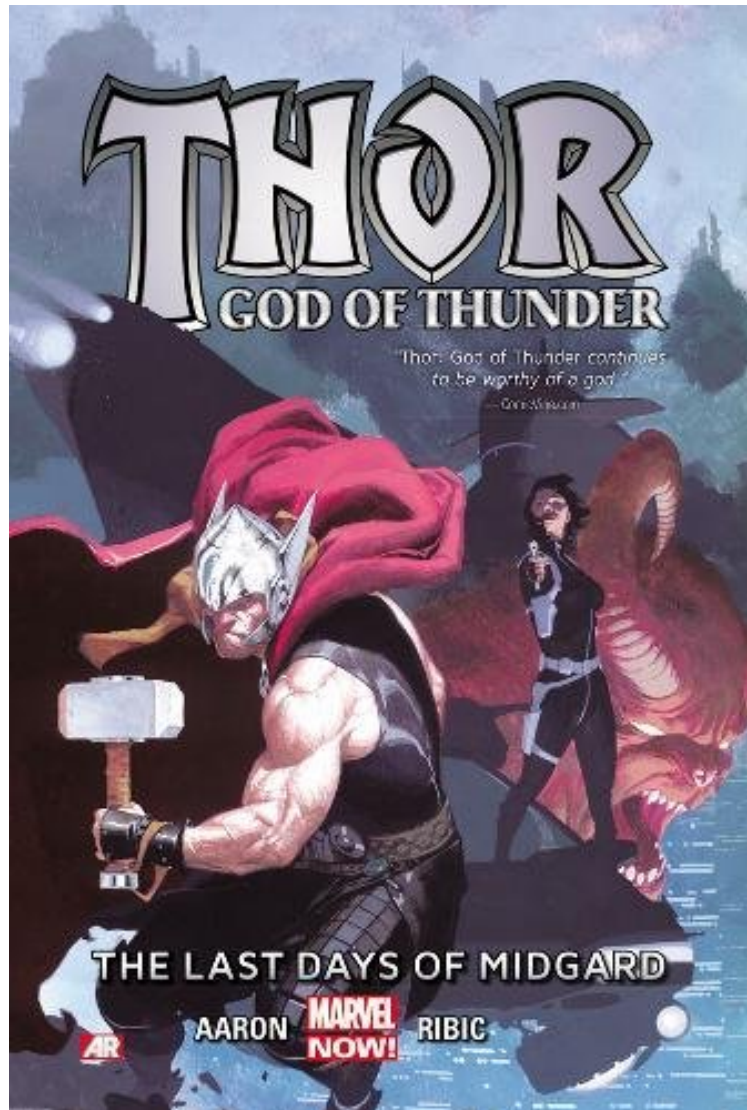

The last issue of this series is just foreshadowing and name-dropping things that Aaron will do later in his run, which is fine, but it feels like a bad ending for this series, setting the stage for the next.

Old Thor fights Galactus and it ends leading into the storyline that shifts the hammer to a new female Thor, which I've been curious about. Great stuff, highly recommend, just skip Vol 3.
