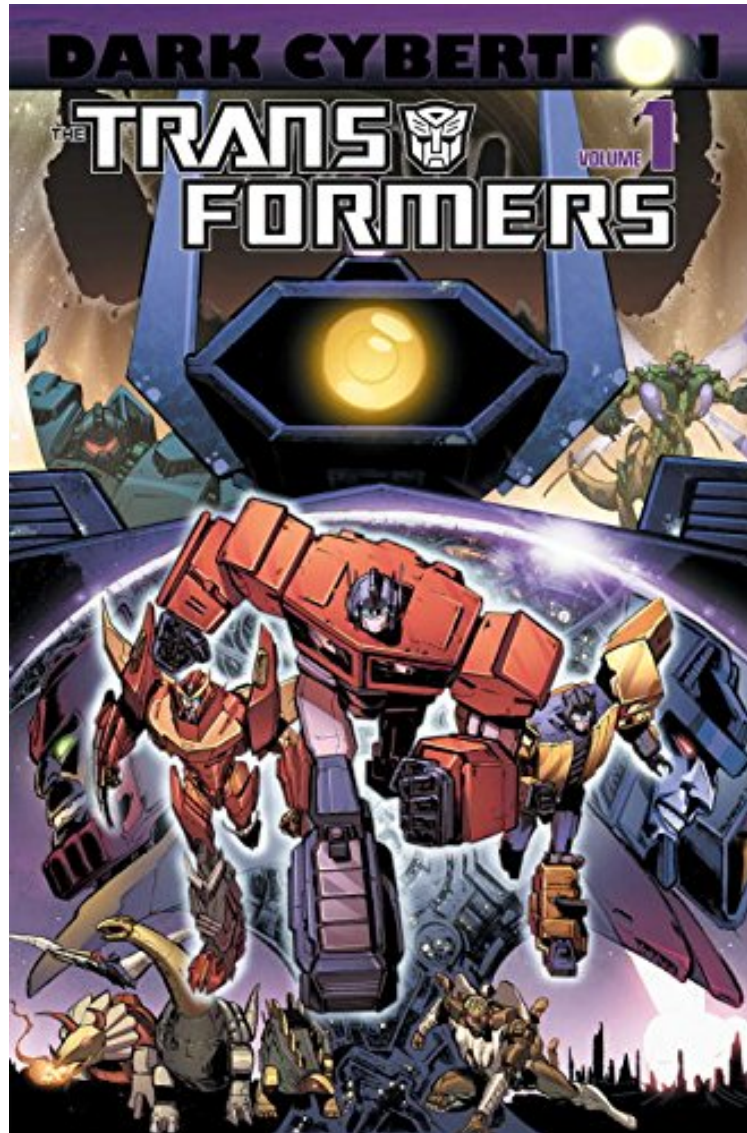

Greenagel II This is a decent Transformers tale and is really an "event" book that ties together several different Transformers titles. The jewel in the crown of the Transformers franchise is James Roberts masterful work on the MTMTE series (if you haven't read it, stop reading this review and go buy volumes 1-5 immediately). Roberts is one of the writers/directors of this arc, which is sold in two 6-issue trades. Obviously, this is part one. The war is over. Starscream rules Cybertron (by vote,

not by conquest), Optimus Prime has relinquished his title and gone back to being known as Orion Pax. Bumblebee and Prowl run the Autobots on Cybertron while Rodimus has led a group of entertaining characters on a quest on the Lost Light (a ship - this is the basis of MTMTE). The Decepticons are in disarray, but Shockwave continues to scheme. It is here that Dark Cybertron begins.
