Overlord, a Phase-6 Transformer, has abandoned the Decepticon cause and has taken over the prison planet of Garrus-9. He tortures Autobots and Decepticons, forces them to fight in pits and rules over them with a bloody, spiked fist. Autobot high command becomes aware of this and sends in the Wreckers to liberate the Autobot prisoners. Both the veterans and rookies realize that this feels like a suicide mission - a planet full of Decepticons and one of the most powerful and nasty Transformer of all time. I grew up with a rough selection of Transformers comics (Armada, Beast Wars, etc.), but being the book worm that I was, I got a more satisfying read from novels and various other works.Cue the discovery of MTMTE. If you haven't heard of the TF Fan Fiction/Fan Service comic line, I highly recommend checking it out. Not only does it supply great dialogue and an intriguing story line, but as the descendant of Last Stand of The Wreckers, I now fully understand why LSOTW comic was a must read for every Transformers enthusiast.The artwork and dialogue within the comic flow lucidly with one another, supplying now only an enticing story, but jarring and explicit images that left me stunned even after I finished the comic. There's a certain kind of atmosphere developed that allows even curious readers to become engrossed into the comic and actually answer the common question many Transformer fans are asked: "But aren't they just robots?" That, I believe, magnifies the impact of the comic in more ways than just "giant killing machines shooting stuff" (ironic as that is the main objective of the Wreckers).The comic itself intertwines with various other arcplots throughout the Transformers IDW universe, so some portions of the comic may not appear clear or have the same impact it would on avid readers of the series, but the central theme of the comic and the weight of its essence will surely leave the reader with a desire to reread it a second time.1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. Well I'm not going to spoil anything but I will say this story is not for kids and if you've been a Transformers fan for any great length of time this is most likely the story you always wanted to read (even if you never knew it). This hard cover is a reprinting/touch-up of the trade that was released a year or so ago (think of this version as a special edition), now if you already own the trade are there any reasons to double dip? Oh my yes, first of all it's over-sized and has a very nice hardcover, secondly the artists went back and retouched the art so that the human character looks less derpy (it's not a huge thing but it really does improve the overall feel of the book), and thirdly you get a boatload of new extras at the end of the book including all of the extras from the original trade and a few new epilogues for the cast. The best way to think of this book is as Last Stand of The Wreckers Absolute Edition (yes the presentation and extras are that good).
