Many different groups of bots appear, but the Dinobots are heavily featured. The first half of the story is a mystery with the bots trying to find the cannibal murderer, killing and then stealing energon from bots. The second half features some interesting organic beasts that I really enjoyed seeing battle. There's a lot of really cool action shots in this book, but I was kind of lost while reading. I wasn't familiar with the characters. If you only know the Transformers movies, I wouldn't suggest this book unless you're ready to meet a new world. Although visually stunning, I didn't think the stories or characters had much depth. I give this graphic novel a 3/5.

After college, Mairghread worked her way up as an assistant while writing plays and honing her talents. Then she landed a job as a Script Coordinator for Transformers Prime and G.I. Joe Renegades. Mairghread got her first opportunity to join a writer's room there and it led to her first professional script, "Stronger, Faster."
